Finding 9078: School is not properly implementing Offer vs. Serve.

As observed on the Day of Review, one or more cashiers did not demonstrate a clear understanding of OVS and its requirements. Where a student selected a reimbursable meal, the student was made to select an additional item(s). This occurred for breakfast meal service - students already had three items including a fruit and they were told to grab an additional fruit.

Corrective Action:

As corrective action, retrain cashiers in OVS requirements, including the daily enforcement of OVS requirements. Provide written documentation of the training, including the date, the agenda, and a sign in sheet of attendees.

Technical Assistance:

The school was provided technical assistance during the on-site visit.

Finding 10157: Buy American

Review of agricultural food components indicates violations of the Buy American provision. Documentation was not available to determine if domestic alternatives were considered or exceptions were granted. The school purchased cherry tomatoes that were a product of Mexico.

Corrective Action:

As corrective action, the FSD will reach out to the food distributor to ensure all future deliveries are products from the United States. Provide this correspondence to the state agency when completed.

Technical Assistance:

If a kitchen manager receives a delivery with product not from the United States and they have available substitutions, the products can be sent back to the distributor.

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
