An inspection of your workplace of employment has revealed conditions which we believe do not comply with the provisions of the Indiana Occupational Safety and Health Act (Indiana Code Chapter 22-8-1.1) or the standards or rules adopted thereunder. Accordingly, enclosed please find safety order(s) and notification(s) of penalty describing such violation(s) with references to applicable standards, rules or provisions of the statute and stating the amount of any penalty(ies).

Informal Conference – Please be advised that it may be possible to informally settle any potential dispute without initiating the more elaborate proceedings brought on by a petition for review. Prior to filing a petition for review, you may request an informal conference concerning any results of the inspection (safety orders, penalties, abatement dates, etc.) by contacting the Indiana Department of Labor/IOSHA, preferably by telephone, in a prompt manner. Please be advised that a request for an informal conference cannot extend the fifteen working day period for filing a petition for review. Informal conferences frequently resolve any possible disputes, and therefore you are urged to take advantage of this opportunity. Because of the limited time period and in order to facilitate scheduling, any requests for an informal conference should be made promptly upon your receipt of the safety order(s) and notification(s) of penalty.

**Right to Contest** – You are hereby also notified that you are entitled to seek administrative review of the safety order(s), penalty(ies), or both by filing a written petition for review at the above address postmarked within fifteen working days of your receipt of the safety order(s) and notification(s) of penalty. ("Working days" means Mondays through Fridays, but does not include Saturdays, Sundays, legal holidays under a state statute or days on which the Indiana Department of Labor's offices are closed during regular business hours). If you do not file such a petition for review (contest), the safety order(s)

and penalty(ies) shall be deemed final orders of the Board of Safety Review and not subject to review by any court or agency. The issuance of a safety order does not constitute a finding that a violation has occurred unless no petition for review is filed, or if a petition for review (contest) is filed, it must contain a statement of its basis and should reference the above inspection number. Upon receipt of your petition for review, we will affirm, amend or dismiss the safety order(s) and notification(s) of penalty. If we affirm, your petition for review will be granted (unless it was not timely) and the dispute will be certified by the Board of Safety Review for further proceedings. The Board of Safety Review is an independent board appointed by the governor with authority to conduct legal proceedings leading up to and including administrative hearings or assign an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) to conduct the same, and to issue decisions concerning disputed safety orders and notifications of penalties. If we amend the safety order(s) or notification(s) of penalty, your petition for review shall be deemed moot. However, you will then be given an opportunity to file a petition for review concerning the amended safety order(s) and notification(s) of penalty.

Please be advised that an employee or representative of employees may file a petition for review to contest the reasonableness of the time stated in the safety order(s) for the abatement of any violation.

**Posting** - Upon receipt of any safety order(s) you are required to post such safety order(s), or a copy thereof, unedited, at or near each place an alleged violation referred to in the safety order(s) occurred. However, if your operations are such that it is not practicable to post the safety order(s) at or near each place of alleged violation, such safety order(s) shall be posted, unedited, in a prominent place where it will be readily observable by all affected employees. For example, if you are engaged in activities which are physically dispersed, the safety order(s) may be posted at the location from which the employees operate to carry out their activities. You must take steps to ensure that the safety order is not altered, defaced, or covered by other material. Posting shall be until the violation is abated, or for three working days, whichever is longer.

**Penalties** - Penalties are due within fifteen (15) working days of receipt of this notification unless contested. Abatement does not constitute payment of penalties.

- (1) You file a petition for review concerning the violation, in which case the full abatement period shall commence from the issuance of a final decision by the Board of Safety Review or the courts which requires compliance with the safety order; or
- (2) The abatement period is extended by the granting of a petition for modification of abatement date.

PMAs - The petition for modification of abatement date is a manner in which you may seek additional time to correct (abate) a violation without having to file a petition for review concerning the safety order, or after the expiration of the time period to file such a petition for review when it becomes apparent that you need extra time to abate the violation. A petition for modification of abatement date shall be in writing and shall include the following information:

- (1) All steps you have taken, and the dates of such actions, in an effort to achieve compliance during the prescribed abatement period.
  - (2) The specific additional abatement time necessary in order to achieve compliance.
- (3) The reasons such additional time is necessary, including the unavailability of professional or technical personnel or of materials and equipment, or because necessary construction or alteration of facilities cannot be completed by the original abatement date.
- (4) All available interim steps being taken to safeguard employees against the cited hazard during the abatement period.
- (5) A certification that a copy of the petition has been posted, and if appropriate, served on the authorized representative of affected employees, and a certification of the date upon which such posting and service was made.

A petition for modification of abatement date shall be filed with the Indiana Department of Labor/IOSHA no later than the close of the next working day following the date on which abatement was originally required. A later-filed petition shall be accompanied by the employer's statement of exceptional circumstances explaining the delay. A copy of such petition shall be posted in a conspicuous place where all affected employees will have notice thereof or near such location where the violation occurred. The petition shall remain posted until the time period for the filing of a petition for review of the Commissioner's granting or denying the petition expires. Where affected employees are represented by an authorized representative, said representative shall be served a copy of such petition.

**Notification of Corrective Action** - Correction of the alleged violations which have an abatement period of thirty (30) days or less should be reported in writing to us promptly upon correction. A "Letter of Abatement" form and an "Abatement Photographs" worksheet are enclosed for your assistance in providing adequate documentation of abatement. Reports of corrections should show specific corrective action on each alleged violation and the date of such action. On alleged violations with abatement periods of more than thirty (30) days, a written progress report should be submitted, detailing what has been done, what remains to be done, and the time needed to fully abate each such violation. When the alleged violation is fully abated, we should be so advised. Timely correction of an alleged violation does not affect the initial proposed penalty.

## Safety Order 1 Item 1 Type of Violation: **Serious**

IC 22-8-1.1 Section 2: The employer did not furnish employment and a place of employment which was free from recognized hazards that were causing or likely to cause death or serious physical harm to employees, in that the employees were exposed to potential fire and/or deflagration (explosion) hazards because methods were not utilized to contain combustible dusts such as, but not limited to wood dust from becoming airborne and combining with an ignition source:

a) Outside against the East wall of the Gray Building - A dust collector was used to collect the wood dust created during the ripping of boards on the XL Ripper. Although a dust collector was on site, it was not being utilized to collect the wood dust being created by the XL Ripper which resulted in wood dust accumulating under and around the XL Ripper, on rafters, on the dust collection air ducts, and an electrical transformer. Wood dust being created be the XL Ripper could potentially ignite when it comes into contact with an ignition source.

Among other methods, one feasible and acceptable method to correct this hazard is to protect the dust collectors in accordance with Section 9.6.1 of the National Fire Protection Agency's (NFPA) Standard for the Prevention of Fires and Dust Explosions in Wood Processing and Woodworking Facilities (NFPA 664-2020). Section 9.6.1 of NFPA 664-2020 states that when deflagrable wood dust is produced by process equipment, continuous suction to capture and contain fugitive dust shall be provided.

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b) Outside against the East wall of the Red Building - A 53 foot semi trailer is used to collect the wood dust from the dust collection system created during the wood cutting process on the Pendu Saw, the Baker Saw, and the Baker Double Notcher. The dust collection system discharge was leaking wood dust as it was being collected in the trailer. This resulted in wood dust piling up between and both sides of the trailer and the building wall. Wood dust leaking out of the discharge could potentially ignite when it comes into contact with an ignition source.

Among other methods, one feasible and acceptable method to correct this hazard is to protect the dust collectors in accordance with Section 9.7.2.2 of the National Fire Protection Agency's (NFPA) Standard for the Prevention of Fires and Dust Explosions in Wood Processing and Woodworking Facilities (NFPA 664-2020). Section 9.7.2.2 of NFPA 664-2020 states that dust collectors that discharge into storage bins or silos shall do so in a manner that minimizes the generation of dust clouds. The discharge arrangement shall be constructed to minimize dust leaks and shall contain a choke to prevent explosion propagation between the collecting equipment and storage facilities.

#### AGREED ENTRY

The parties to the above-captioned proceeding, the Commissioner of the Indiana

Department of Labor (hereinafter "Complainant") and K & S Pallets, Inc. (hereinafter

"Respondent"), through their duly authorized representatives, desiring to enter into this Agreed

Entry as final settlement of this matter, do hereby stipulate and agree as follows:

- From February 28, 2023, through June 1, 2023, authorized employees of the Indiana
   Department of Labor conducted an inspection at the Respondent's worksite located at 1025
   Osage St., Fort Wayne, Indiana 46808.
- 2. On July 5, 2023, Complainant issued a Safety Order and Notification of Penalty (hereinafter "Safety Order") resulting from Indiana Department of Labor Inspection No. 1653883 and alleging that Respondent had violated the Indiana Occupational Safety and Health Act (IC 22-8-1.1 et seq.) or the standards or rules thereunder. The Safety Order is attached hereto as Exhibit A and is incorporated herein.

 On or about July 27, 2023, Respondent duly and timely petitioned for review of the Safety Order.

#### PART II.

- 48. Safety Order 3, Item 1 is upheld in its entirety.
- 49. Safety Order 3, Item 2 is upheld in its entirety.
- 50. Safety Order 3, Item 3 is upheld in its entirety.
- 51. The AGREED total penalty for all violations and all subparts thereunder, subject to this Agreed Entry, is Twenty Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$20,800).
- 52. In consideration for penalty reductions agreed upon herein, Respondent agrees to complete a comprehensive health and safety consultation with INSafe and provide Complainant with proof of completion within ninety (90) days of the issuance of a Final Order in this matter.
- 53. Complainant agrees to allow Respondent no more than a total of twelve consecutive months to pay the agreed total penalty. Respondent shall make at least one payment of at least One Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty-Three and 34/100 Dollars (\$1,733.34) each consecutive month until the agreed total penalty of \$20,800 is paid in full; the first payment being due with Respondent's execution of this Agreed Entry. Subsequent payments shall be due by the 15<sup>th</sup> day of each month until said penalty is paid in full.
- 54. If Respondent fails to make timely payments or fails to pay the full agreed total penalty as stated herein, the full amount of unpaid penalty that remains shall be immediately due to Complainant, Complainant may use every legal remedy available to collect such unpaid

amount, interest shall begin to accrue on said unpaid amount at the rate of 12% apr compounded daily, and Complainant may collect costs and fees, including legal fees, from Respondent for any collection action that may be necessary to enforce this agreement.

- 55. It is understood and agreed by the Respondent and Complainant that this Agreed Entry and attachments will constitute a final, enforceable OSHA Safety Order(s) and penalties for the purposes of the Indiana Occupational Safety and Health Act ("Act").
- 56. Respondent confirms Complainant's right to re-inspect its workplaces, in accordance with the Act, and to verify abatement of the alleged violations.
- 57. If not already identified in the Safety Order and Notification of Penalty as completed during the inspection, all abatement, including any enhanced abatement identified and agreed upon herein, must still be completed in a timely manner and certified to IOSHA by sending confirmation of abatement, including a detailed description of what was done along with any supporting documentation and photographs, to IOSHA by email to abatement@dol.in.gov.
- 58. Respondent hereby withdraws its petition for review previously filed in this matter, subject to the terms of this agreed entry.

#### PART IV.

- 59. Nothing contained in this Agreed Entry shall be construed to affect Complainant's interpretation of the Act or any standard or regulation enforced pursuant thereto or the applicable classification thereof.
- 60. Except for this agreement, and matters arising out of this agreement and any other subsequent IOSHA proceedings between the parties, none of the foregoing agreements, statements, findings, and actions taken by the Respondent shall be deemed an admission by Respondent of the allegations contained within the Safety Order(s) and Notification(s) of

Penalty. The agreements, statements, findings, and actions taken herein are made in order to compromise and settle this matter economically and amicably, and they shall not be used for any other purpose, except as herein stated.

61. The invalidity or unenforceability of any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Agreed Entry does not affect the remaining sections, subsections, clauses, or provisions of this Agreed Entry.

62. Respondent, upon full execution of this Agreed Entry, will post this Agreed Entry for three (3) working days or until abatement is completed, whichever period is longer, pursuant to Board of Safety Review Rules of Procedure, 615 IAC 1-2-18(b)(3)(C).

Section 9.6.1 of NFPA 664-2020 states that when deflagrable wood dust is produced by process equipment, continuous suction to capture and contain fugitive dust shall be provided.
