Additional Data after Release of Indiana's Monthly Employment Report

- Indiana's unemployment rate has decreased 5.6 percentage points since July 2009 (the low point of employment), which ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in the U.S.
- Indiana's labor force has decreased by 58,625 over the year and is at 3,330,853.
- Indiana's labor force participation rate has outperformed the national average for eight months in a row. Indiana's rate is currently 62.9% vs. 61.5% for national.
- Indiana Private Sector jobs have decreased by 87,600 over the year.
