Workers at Eaton Corporation Clutch Division in Auburn eligible for federal aid

INDIANAPOLIS (January 26, 2007) – The Indiana Department of Workforce Development announced today that the U.S. Department of Labor has ruled that former employees of the Eaton Corporation, Clutch Division, Auburn, Indiana, are eligible to receive services under the federal Trade adjustment assistance.

The TAA program, which is administered at the state level by the Indiana Department of Workforce Development, is made available to workers who are displaced due to foreign imports or shifts in production out of the country.

The federal ruling, which was issued on December 18, 2006, applies to workers who became totally or partially separated from employment on or after December 17, 2006 through December 18, 2008.

In order for dislocated workers to be eligible for TAA benefits, a company executive, union representative or three former employees must file a petition with the Department of Labor and it must be approved before benefits can be released. The investigation was initiated on October 18, 2006 in response to a petition filed by the United Auto Workers, Local 169 on behalf of workers of Eaton Corporation, Clutch Division, Auburn, Indiana. Workers manufacture clutches.

Additionally, the Department of Labor issued a certification for alternative trade adjustment assistance (ATAA) for separated older workers at Eaton's Clutch Division. It was found that a significant number of workers at the company age 50 or over possess skills that are not easily transferable and that competitive conditions within the industry are adverse. Older workers may choose between regular TAA benefits or a wage subsidy of 50% of the difference between their new salary and old salary, up to \$10,000.

The TAA program provides a variety of benefits and services to help unemployed workers prepare for and obtain suitable employment. Workers may be eligible for a variety of re-employment services, job search and relocation allowances and training. In addition, weekly trade re-adjustment allowances may be payable to eligible workers following the exhaustion of unemployment insurance benefits.
