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### **Workers from Brammall, Inc. eligible for federal aid**

INDIANAPOLIS (April 16, 2008) – The Indiana Department of Workforce Development today announced a ruling by the U.S. Department of Labor that former employees of Brammall, Inc., a subsidiary of Tyden Group Holdings Corporation in Angola are eligible to receive services under the federal Trade Adjustment Assistance program.

The TAA program, which is administered at the state level by the Indiana Department of Workforce Development, is made available to workers who are displaced due to foreign imports or shifts in production out of the country.

The federal ruling was issued on March 20, 2008 and applies to workers who became totally or partially separated from employment on or after February 14, 2007 through March 20, 2010. The investigation was initiated on February 20, 2008, in response to a petition filed on behalf of workers of the facility. The workers are engaged in the production of cargo security seals (serialized anti-pilferage hardware). The investigation revealed that the decline in employment at the firm is related to a shift in production of cargo security seals (serialized anti-pilferage hardware) to China, Malaysia and Taiwan, and that the imports of these articles will likely increase.

Additionally, the Department of Labor issued a certification for alternative trade adjustment assistance (ATAA) for separated older workers at Brammall, Inc. It was found that a significant number of workers at the company age 50 or over possess skills that are not easily transferable and that competitive conditions within the industry are adverse. Older workers may choose between regular TAA benefits or a wage subsidy of 50% of the difference between their new salary and old salary, up to \$10,000.

The TAA program provides a variety of benefits and services to help unemployed workers prepare for and obtain suitable employment. Workers may be eligible for a variety of re-employment services, job search and relocation allowances and training. In addition, weekly trade re-adjustment allowances may be payable to eligible workers following the exhaustion of unemployment insurance benefits.
