NEED TO IDENTIFY YOUR SKILLS?

Create an Account

- To create an account, go to lndianaCareerConnect.com
- Click "Sign in" button in the top menu bar
- Choose Option 3: Create a User Account—Individual Registration
- Agree to terms and privacy agreement
- Click on the Comprehensive Registration link
- Continue following the steps and fill in all required fields
- Please note that your user name must be a valid email address

Forgot Username and/or Password

- Click on "Sign in"
- Click on the Retrieve User Name or Password link in Option 1
- Choose the option that applies to you (Forgot Password, Forgot User Name or Forgot User Name and Password) and click the link in that section
- Continue following the steps to reset your user name and/or password

Build A Resume

- Click on the Menu in the top left corner and then click on "Resume Builder" in the Quick Menu section
- Click Create New Resume
- Enter a resume title. TIP: Choose a title that highlights your experience or skills rather than simply listing your name
- Choose your creation method: Quick or Wizard, then click Save
- Click on each subject header and fill in your information
- Scroll down to Additional Employer Searchable Items and add in additional information, if desired
- Once complete, you can print, email or download a copy of your resume by clicking on the icons to the right of your name on your resume

Upload Your Resume

- Click on the Menu in the top right corner and then click on "Resume Builder" in the Quick Menu section
- Click Upload Resume
- Enter a resume title. TIP: Choose a title that highlights your experience or skills rather than simply listing your name
- Choose your creation method: Quick or Wizard, then click Save
- Click "Select Resume File" and then "Choose File", then click Save
- Scroll down to Additional Employer Searchable Items and add in additional information, if desired

Search for Jobs

- Click on the Menu in the top left corner and then click on Job Search in the Quick Menu
- Enter search criteria (job title, company, occupation or military code) along with the are you want to search in and click on Quick Search

Apply for a Job

- From the job search results screen, click on the job posting title that interests you
- Review the job posting details
- If you would like to apply, simply click the Apply button at the top of the screen
- Some job postings will have multiple ways to apply including applying on an external site

Virtual Recruiter

This option will allow Indiana Career Connect to search jobs for you

- Click on the Menu in the top left corner and then click on Job Search in the Quick Menu section
- Enter search criteria (job title, company, occupation or military code) along with the area you want to search in and click on Quick Search
- Scroll to the bottom of the search results page and click Save as Virtual Recruiter

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE BENEFITS

HOW DO I FILE FOR BENEFITS?

File as soon as you become unemployed. This begins the one week non-paid waiting period. You will only be paid benefits for eligible claims filed after this waiting period. Your weekly claim must be completed by 8:59PM on Saturday for each week you are unemployed to receive benefits the following week. All Unemployment Insurance claims must be filed online at www.in.gov/dwd/unemployment

STEP 1: Apply

- A valid email account your email address will become your Uplink Username.
- Driver's license or valid ID, address, Social Security number, date of birth and phone number.
- Last employer's name, mailing address, phone number, dates of employment and reason you are unemployed.
- Bank routing number and account number if choosing direct deposit as your payment option (NOTE: Key2Benefits prepaid MasterCard® is also available).

STEP 2: Filing Weekly Vouchers

- Vouchers should be filed WEEKLY through the Uplink filing system.
 Submit your weekly voucher the week following your initial application and each week thereafter.
- Benefits are paid weekly. Weeks run from Sunday, 12:00 a.m. to Saturday, 8:59 p.m. Eastern time. Vouchers cover the previous week and may be filed starting on Sunday.
- You should file a weekly voucher even if you have an issue delaying your benefits or are appealing a decision. When a determination is made all eligible payments will be released.



UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE BENEFITS

STEP 3: What happens after I file my claim?

- Within10 days of filing, you will receive a monetary determination form. It is a statement providing a possible weekly benefit amount and an overall maximum amount if you are eligible and qualify to receive benefits. Your maximum length of regular benefits is 26 weeks
- Check your Correspondence History on the Home Page Weekly
- Eligibility will be determined during the first 21 business days if there
 are no issues with your claim. Check your claimant homepage
 daily throughout this time at: www.unemployment.in.gov
- Eligible recipients may choose between Direct Deposit and a Key2Benefits prepaid Mastercard (If a card, you will receive it shortly after the first payment has been released).

STEP 4: Identity Verification Needed

- Due to an increase in unemployment fraud cases, the Department of Workforce Development is using a third party service called ID.ME to verify unemployment applicants' identities in order to safeguard against future fraud.
- After filing your initial claim, a To-Do for Identity Verification Needed should show up on your Uplink homepage (please note: this will not show up immediately). You must click on the link and follow the steps to verify your identity.
- This process will require you to upload documentation such as a valid driver's license or state ID and can be completed from a smartphone or computer that has a camera.
- Feeling lost trying to navigate this process? WorkOne offices in Linton and Bloomington can help walk you through the ID.ME process. This assistance is offered on an appointment-only basis. Reach out to the Linton or Bloomington office to schedule your appointment.
