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The next item is the Executive Director's Report. Mr. Trevino.

MR. TREVINO: Yes. I'd like to start off by going over the contents of your Board packet. You have today's agenda, you have a public meeting posting for today's meeting, you have the Board minutes for February 15th and March 21st of 2024.

You have today's Claim docket dated

April 18th, 2024 with copies of the purchase
orders and check register, you have a copy of the
CliftonLarsonAllen Financial Report dated

March 31st, 2024 for the month of March, which was
e-mailed to you, hard copy provided.

You have the -- a copy of the State Board of Accounts Report with a file date of April 15th, 2024. You have the Claim docket for -- I mentioned that; I'm sorry. You have First Merchants Bank statement for March for accounts ending in 608 and 616, along with checks that cleared in the month of March for funder account 608. You have First Merchants CDARS report and CD reports for accounts ending in 063 and 321, and

those have run dates of April 16, 2024.

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You have a copy of the Boyce Contract

Amendment, you have a copy of Letter of

Authorization to First Merchants Bank dated

April 18th, 2024 regarding transferring 2.25

million to the City of East Chicago, which is

affiliated with an MOU that we have with the City

of East Chicago, and that's also attached to the

Letter of Authorization.

You have a copy of the Grand Cal River

Remediation Proposal outline, you have an MOU with

the City of East Chicago dated April 18th, 2024.

I'm sorry; it's April 18th, and that was -- the

one that was in your packet was April 15th, and as

I mentioned, that -- there was a few amendments

made to that, so the MOU that we'll be considering

as part of the action items is dated April 18th.

You have a copy of Tetra Tech's Grand Cal River Report dated April 4, 2024. We have a copy of BMO Trust Report for the month of March 2024. You have the Army Corps Report to the Board dated April 18th, 2024, and you also have Attorney Ellen Gregory's Report to the Board, with a revision date of April 15th, 2024.

You have Jacob's Report on the Sheet Pile

Wall Project for the month of March 2024, and you also have a city flier regarding "Team Up and Clean Up" community outreach dated April 19th, 2024, which is tomorrow. And that concludes the items in your -- in your packet.

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I'll go over a couple of items. Regarding the action items on today's agenda, we have the Board minutes for February 15th and March 21st.

We have the Boyce Agreement Amendment. We have a Letter of Authorization to transfer two and a quarter million dollars to the City of East Chicago related to an MOU we have with the City.

We have the Great Lakes Legacy Act, Grand Cal River Marsh Sediment Remediation Project Proposal.

We have the MOU with the City of East Chicago regarding the Canal Street Bridge Underwater Obstruction.

A few updates to report on regarding the Old Cline Avenue Bridge. Attorney Weiser and I have had a few meetings with representatives from Lake County to begin discussions on what it would take to remove the bridge.

Regarding the District's finances, a check from the Army Corps of Engineers related to the PCA Amendment was received in the amount of 2.698

million and was deposited in early March.

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We have gone through the State Board of Account audit process for the period of 2019 through 2023, and I will provide the update on the report when we get to that on the agenda.

Regarding user fees, work on 2024 user fees is ongoing.

Regarding the PCA Amendment and tipping fee agreement amendments, as I mentioned, we received a check for 2.698 million from the Corps related to the PCA amendment.

Regarding the tipping fee agreement amendment, I mentioned in the past that we had received a payment from Cleveland-Cliffs.

However, based on our calculations, it appears they are short approximately 316,000 and some change. We have sent Cleveland-Cliffs a letter and a couple of e-mails informing them of the shortfall. They have responded that they are looking into the matter and should get back to us within a week or so.

Regarding the Great Lakes Legacy Act
Project, the South Tank Farm Sheet Pile Wall
Project is ongoing. A copy of the Jacob's Monthly
Progress Report for the month of March is in your

Board packet. The Sheet Pile Wall construction is forecasted to be done by early this year.

However, the groundwater management system will continue to be fine tuned for some time.

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Regarding the Lake George Canal East
Section, the Corps is managing the dredging
project on EPA's behalf. The Corps has received
and is reviewing the data for additional
environmental sediment samples collected last
year, and they are planning to collect additional
geotechnical samples in the spring of this year.
Phase 2 dredging of the Lake George Canal East and
orphanariums are scheduled to be done in 2025.

Regarding the Lake George Canal Project

Agreement modification, on occasion I had reported
to the Board on the progress of the Lake George

Canal Project Agreement modification. It is
further complicated as it impacts -- and is
impacted by a separate cost-share agreement
between the District and BP.

Over the last few months there has been very little to no progress of the modification of the Project Agreement; however, last week, Thursday, I was informed that EPA and BP had been working on modifying the Project Agreement without

the District's participation, without informing the District, or providing any notice of this ongoing effort.

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During our project team conference call last Friday, I made it clear to the Corps, BP and EPA that I was very upset that this was going on without our knowledge, for various reasons, and some of those I'll explain. The first one is the district is signatory to the Project Agreement, and there should -- and therefore should be part of any ongoing discussions or negotiations.

At minimum, we should be made aware of any discussions or be copied on any correspondence and proposed amendments to the Project Agreement. It is our understanding that the waterways of our city are within an environmental justice community, which means there's supposed to be meaningful and respectful engagement with the community and not ignore the community.

I explained to everyone on the call that we have a cost-share agreement with BP which specifies how cost share generated on certain past and ongoing projects will be used to help finance future Great Lakes Legacy Act remediation projects.

BP has recently expressed discontent with this agreement in that they feel they are sharing with the District too large a percentage of the cost share generated by past BP work from various BP projects. Basically they're unhappy with the agreement they made with us in 2018.

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So, as mentioned, the cost-share agreement impacts and is impacted by the Project Agreement, another reason why we should have been involved in all discussions. Their decision not to involve us just doesn't look good. I have asked for copies of past e-mails and documents that have been transmitted between the parties before we were notified that the Project Agreement modification discussions had already begun.

The Corps, BP and EPA apologized for not including us in their meetings and correspondence and assured us that the District would be involved in future discussions. We are hoping that will be the case and we can move forward towards a productive and cooperative partnership.

Regarding the Lake George Canal Middle Cap
Project, the Army Corps of Engineers is managing
this project on behalf of EPA. The main part of
the Cap Project is now completed, and depot

construction activities were performed in March.

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Regarding the Lake George Canal West
Remediation Project, that work is between BP and
EPA and that project is ongoing.

Regarding the Grand Cal River Junction
Reaches Remedial Design, Tetra Tech remedial
design work is ongoing. The project team
continues to have biweekly project meetings to
discuss the remediation design, coordination of
additional site investigation work, design
completion, property access coordination, permit
applications, junction marsh coordination,
coordination with the former city dump site, and
community engagement.

Regarding the schedule for the Grand Cal River Junction Reaches Remediation, in 2024 we're forecasting that EPA will complete their source control memo, completion of the additional site investigation work, finalizing the remedial design. We have a project presentation to EPA's Technical Review Committee scheduled for May 2nd, finalizing the project agreement.

And today we have on the agenda the Grand Cal River Junction Marsh Sediment Remediation Proposal for the Board's approval consideration,

and if approved, we plan to submit the complete and final proposal to EPA prior to the May 2nd presentation to the Tech -- to their Technical Review Committee, and then construction would start in 2025.

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Regarding work-in-kind reporting, I have submitted our annual 2023 work-in-kind report, and I'm working on scheduling a meeting with EPA to review our accumulated cost share to make sure we have upfront concurrence on how much cost share we have accumulated for the Grand Cal River Remediation Project. Jim Wescott of Tetra Tech is present today to provide additional updates and answer any questions.

Grand Cal River Stewardship Day planning is scheduled for April 30th at 9:30 at the Seidner Dune & Swale Nature Preserve.

Regarding the Canal Street Bridge Project, as you are aware, the Canal Street Bridge Dawson Project has been completed; however, there's been an underwater obstruction identified near the former bridge. There have been various meetings with stakeholders on the matter, including a site visit today with representative from the Corps and BP.

The City has asked the District to manage this situation on their behalf. Because the bridge belongs to the City and the last MOU was specific to the Canal Street Bridge Dolphins, we will have to enter into a new MOU with the City. The proposed MOU that's in your packet has a revision date of 4-15, but has been modified slightly, so the MOU that you're asked to approve is the one that has been modified afterward and provided to you with a revision date of April 18th, 2024.

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Regarding the Atlantic Richfield Settlement Agreement, as I've mentioned in the past, we've received and deposited the 4.5 million dollars that was affiliated with the Settlement Agreement. The property transfer was completed in January, and the project team continues to work on completing various ancillary action items that are affiliated with the Settlement Agreement.

Regarding the Army Corps of Engineer

Dredging Project, the Corps' report is in your

Board packet. Project manager Mike Nguyen will be

providing an update to the Board. The last CDF

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     through December 31st, 2023. The objective of the
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     audit was to determine compliance with applicable
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     Indiana law, regulations, and the uniform
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     compliance quidelines established by the Indiana
     State Board of Accounts pursuant to Indiana
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Code 5-11-1-24.

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The Indiana State Board of Accounts audit concluded without any reportable instances of noncompliance. We plan to post the audit report on out Web site, as we've done in the past, and that should be done within a couple of weeks.

The fact that we had no reportable noncompliance instances did not happen by accident. It takes hard work and attention to details, so I want to thank representatives from the CliftonLarsonAllen team: Vanessa Vargas, Monica Johnson, and even Tim Anderson, who is no longer with them but managed our accounts during the audit period. So, I want to thank them for their hard work and services over the years.

I also want to thank Attorney Ellen Gregory and Paul Dekozney for their work, and the Board of Directors for keeping us on our toes. During the audit process, there were various reports and information requested from BMO and First Merchants, so I'd like to thank them as well for their cooperation. We've had various complicated projects and agreements during the audit period, so kudos to the District's entire team. And a copy -- as I mentioned, a copy of the report is in

your Board packet.

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MR. BAKOTE: You know, I'd like to say congratulations on everybody involved. I have been in front of the State Board of Accounts before with the Water Department, and they always find something wrong with this or that, and to see that there was no -- no reported instance of noncompliance, it's really a great thing there.

MR. FEKETE: That was John Bakote. Thank you, John, for your comments.

Okay. The next item of business is the Accounting Consultant Report. Vanessa?

MS. VARGAS: Good evening, everyone.

And before I start with the report, I just want to say thank you to Fernando for all of his hard work and help during the audit as well, just because I know he will not give himself those kudos.

So, thank you, Fernando.

In front of you, you have a copy of the financial statements -- oh, I'm sorry; this is Vanessa Vargas with CLA. In front of you, you have a copy of the financial statements on a cash basis dated March 31st, 2024. If you turn to page 2, we will begin with the statement of cash receipts and cash disbursements for the three

months ended March 31st, 2024.

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You've received interest income totaling \$115,912.23. You've collected user fees totaling \$3,760.85; had a trust transfer in the amount of \$251,083.25; as well as other income relating to the PCA and TFA amendments in the amount of \$7,163,996.81; bringing your total receipts to \$7,534,753.14.

You've had cash disbursements totaling \$414,249.41. This brings you to an increase in cash in the amount of \$7,120,503.73. Your cash balance on January 1st, 2024 was \$8,709,684.13. Your cash balance as of March 31st is \$15,830,187.86.

If you turn to page 3, we will continue with the schedule of cash account activity for the three months ended March 31st, 2024. The operating account began the year with a cash balance on January 1st of \$1,121,983.80. You've earned interest totaling \$10,828.35. You've had cash disbursements totaling \$414,232.41. You received a trust transfer in the amount of \$251,083.25, as well as a budget transfer in the amount of \$278,830.16, bringing your operating cash balance as of March 31st to \$1,248,493.15.

The user fee account began the year with a cash balance on January 1st totaling \$5,224,499.34. You've earned interest totaling \$84,259.71. You've had cash disbursements as well as a budget transfer totaling \$1,778,847.16. You've collected user fees totaling 3,760.85, as well as other income in the amount of \$7,163,996.81. This brings your user fee account balance as of March 31st to \$10,697,669.55.

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You began the year with a CD with a balance of \$2,363,200.99. You've earned interest in the amount of \$20,824.17, as well as purchased a CD in the amount of one million, and CDARS in the amount of 500,000, bringing your total CD and CDAR balance as of March 31st to \$3,884,025.16.

If you turn to page 4, we will continue with the schedule of 2024 available budget as of April 18th, 2024. Your total 2024 budget appropriation was 1,306,000. Adding back in your 12-31-2023 accounts payable in the amount of \$345,897.21 brings your 2024 total appropriation to \$1,651,897.21. You've had cash disbursements for the three months ended March 2024 totaling \$414,249.41.

So, in the last month we continued to work with Fernando on the draft project proposal, which you just approved and discussed, and then we're working with EPA on trying to bring together the original project, and then as we talked in the past, the additional task that we have called Phase 2, and we're trying to bring those two projects together.

EPA is doing some work independently -- or not really independently, but directly doing some site investigation this summer, which Tetra Tech is also involved in, so I'm trying to make sure that the District effort doesn't get ahead of itself, but it seems like it's all coming together here in the next 30 days with the EPA-led effort.

So, there should be a lot of activity between now and the end of summer. So far we've just kind of been waiting for EPA to get rolling on their part of it. But it looks good, and if you looked at the project outline, there's, you know, sufficient in-kind to pay for the combined project once that gets approved.

The first one, the money market and CD holdings, this page shows the combined balance of your money market account and your certificate of deposit with BMO. The current value of these two accounts is \$3,992,225.18. There was a total increase in the money market account bearing interest credit of \$406.25. So, that was for the month of -- the month of March.

And then the second page shows the historical data of the trust showing distributions, and so far in the year 2024 there have been distributions of \$251,083.25. That covers the two accounts with BMO.

If there's any questions, I'd be answer to answer those for you.

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MR. FEKETE: Any questions?

MR. SANTORE: You're welcome.

MR. FEKETE: The next item of business is the U.S. Army Corps Reports. Was --

MR. NGUYEN: Yes. This is Mike Nguyen with the Army Corps of Engineer.

For the CDF construction facility operation, we're still working on the wastewater treatment plant contract, and once it's awarded, treatment will begin, hopefully in the summertime, or if not, in the fall. The dike construction is ongoing. It's on schedule to be complete by June of this year, and with the dredging contract, our contractor is scheduled to mobilize in August and start dredging after Labor Day.
