4205.00.00 APPEAL REQUEST

An appeal is a request for a fair hearing before a representative of the FSSA Administrative Law Proceedings for the purpose of deciding whether the action taken or proposed by the agency is correct. An appeal is any clear, written **or verbal** expression by the applicant/recipient, or individual authorized to act for him, stating that he wants an opportunity to appeal. If a verbal request is made, the request is to be noted and the applicant or recipient informed that the request must be made in writing. the phone call will be recorded for future reference, and a case note should be made that an appeal request was made over the phone with relevant details. A separate written appeal request is not required.

Appeal requests must be filed with the Division of Family Resources (DFR) in one of the following ways:

- Mail or fax to the FSSA document center
- File in person at the Local DFR Office
- Verbally by calling the DFR Office

An Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) of Office of Administrative Law Proceedings will conduct a fair hearing on the action(s) under appeal and will render a decision on the findings of the hearing.¹ This decision is binding on the DFR.

If an individual wishes to withdraw their appeal request, this can be accepted in all of the same methods as the initial appeal. (42 CFR 432.223).⁴
