Home Modification

HOM Available under Pathways, Health and Wellness, and TBI

What is HOM?

HOM are changes made to adapt a living space to meet the needs of the individual with physical limitations so they can continue to live independently and safely.

HOM providers will submit bids for the modification and the lowest bid that meets the minimum requirements will be chosen. Two bids will be gathered for any modification over \$5,000.

There is a lifetime cap for \$20,000 available for HOM and a \$1,000 annual allowance for repair for individuals.

Acceptable modifications include:

- Adaptive door openers and locks
- Bathroom modifications
- Home control units
- Kitchen modifications
- Home safety devices
- Ramps
- Vertical lift or stair lift
- Widening doorways

What is needed to provide HOM?

Any applicable licensure based on modification being completed; home inspector, plumber, architect, evaluator certification, or residential contractor's license- home modifications.
