Sarcoma and Bone Cancer


July is national sarcoma and bone cancer awareness month. The American Cancer Society's estimates for primary cancer of the bones and joints for 2024 in the United States are about 3,970 new cases diagnosed (2,270 in males and 1,700 in females). This will also account for about 2,050 deaths (1,100 deaths in males and 950 in females). Primary bone cancers, cancers that start in the bones, are uncommon, and account for less than 1% of all cancers. In adults, cancers that spread to the bones from other organs are much more common than primary bone cancers. ¹

Risk Factors and Bone Health

- Most known risk factors for bone cancer such as age and certain bone diseases and inherited conditions cannot be changed. Other than exposure to radiation, there are no known lifestyle-related or environmental causes of bone cancer.¹
- The skeleton is made of bones that help protect soft organs like the brain, heart, and lungs from injury
- Bones are also responsible for working with muscles to hold up the body when we walk or run
- Bones house bone marrow which is responsible for making blood cells²
- Cancer and it's treatments can lead to bone loss
