Readoption Review

I. Continued Need for the Rule

There is a continued need for this rule because this rule sets the fees to receive disability identification bracelets and identification cards from the Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) and sets forth the information that appears on those bracelets and cards.

This rule sets a fee, which is the minimum required for IDOH to make the bracelets and identification card. There are no regulated entities under this rule, therefore there are no consumers of products affected by this rule.

This rule achieves its regulatory goal in the least restrictive manner by setting the minimum requirements to obtain disability identification bracelets and identification cards. This rule does not duplicate any state or federal requirements because it fulfills the statutory requirement in 16-32-4-4 to set reasonable fees and the information that will appear on the identification bracelets and identification

This rule is less than ten sections long and is written for ease of comprehension.

This rule sets requirements to receive disability identification bracelet and cards from IDOH. There is nothing to enforce.

II. Analysis of fees, fines, and civil penalties under IC 4-22-2-19.6

This rule sets a fee of \$10 for an identification card, \$20 for a bracelet, and \$25 for both an identification card and bracelet. This amount is the minimum amount necessary to make the card and bracelet.

III. Complaints and Comments

There have been no complaints or comments about this rule.

IV. Difficulties Encountered

The previous vendor no longer makes the bracelets and IDOH is seeking a new vendor

V. Changes in Technology, Economic Conditions, or Other Factors

There have been no changes to technology or economic conditions.
