Condition Name:

Cronobacter infection, invasive, infants

Condition Name in NBS:

Cronobacter, invasive infant infection

Reporting Timeframe:

Within One Working Day

TO REPORT:

- NBS users: Report conditions via Morbidity Report in <u>NBS</u>
- Non-NBS users: Report with <u>this</u> form

Associated Reportable Laboratory Results

- Isolation of Cronobacter spp. from a clinical specimen
- Detection of Cronobacter spp. in a clinical specimen

Condition Specific Reporting Details

Clinical, Epidemiological, Lab Report, and Treatment information sections within the NBS Morbidity Report

Additional Documentation to Include

- Applicable lab results
- Applicable patient medical records
- Any noted exposure history, such as feeding history (exclusively breastfed, infant formula type, etc.)
