### **Detailed Race Variables**



What is it?

The detailed race variables in the National Electronic Disease Surveillance System (NEDSS) Base System (NBS) are separate race variables that provide the ability to collect additional race information for patients beyond the five standard race categories: American Indian or Alaska Native; Asian, Black, or African American; Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander; and White.

#### Why is this important?


Collecting detailed race information will provide a better understanding of health disparities in Indiana and identify populations experiencing an increased burden of disease. This information will inform the implementation of targeted healthcare resources and interventions to combat these disparities.

## Where are these variables in NBS?

- The detailed race variables are being implemented gradually to NBS investigations. The variables can be found on the "patient" tab within an investigation, after the existing "race" variable. After selecting a race value(s), the corresponding detailed race variable(s) will appear on the screen.
- The detailed race variables can also be found on all patient files within the "demographics" tab.

### **Example**

An investigator completes an interview with the patient, Jane Doe. When asked her race, Jane says she is Burmese. In NBS, the investigator selects "Asian" in the race variable and "Burmese" in the detailed race Asian variable. The investigator's selections in NBS are shown below.
