






WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT FALL VACCINES 2024

Immunizations have been shown to lower risk of severe disease. Speak to your health care provider about the best timing for you.

	<p>People 6 months of age and older</p>	<p>Updated 2024–2025 flu vaccine</p>	<p>During flu season. September and October remain the best times for most people to get vaccinated</p>
	<p>Everyone aged 6 months and older should get 1 updated Moderna, Novavax, or Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine to be up to date.</p>	<p>Updated 2024–2025 COVID-19 vaccine</p>	<p>During fall and winter respiratory disease season</p>
	<p>Adults over 75 and older and adults 60-74 at increased risk of severe RSV</p>	<p>NOT AN ANNUAL VACCINE</p>	<p>In late summer or early fall</p>
	<p>Pregnant women at 32-36 weeks</p>	<p>Pfizer Abrysvo is the only RSV vaccine approved for pregnant women</p>	<p>September through January</p>
	<p>Infants 19 months and younger</p>	<p>Monoclonal antibody shot</p>	<p>October through the end of March</p>
