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| Specimen Requirements | Capillary and Venous blood specimens are accepted from all Health Care Providers throughout the State in support of the Lead and Healthy Homes Program. |
| | Specimens are accepted for both Medicaid and non-Medicaid eligible patients. |
| | All children enrolled in Medicaid should be tested at 1 and 2 years of age, or at 3 to 6 years of age if not tested previously. Testing of children enrolled in Medicaid should be done regardless of risk factors. |
| | Any child or adult at risk for Lead Poisoning can be tested. Contact your Local Health Department for more information. |
| | Capillary blood from a fingerstick is collected onto a filter paper card to screen for Lead poisoning. Filter paper cards are provided to registered submitters upon request. |
| | Whole Blood Venous specimens for confirmatory or follow-up testing should be collected in purple top vacutainers. |

| | Collection supplies such as lancets, dried blood spot cards, postage-paid business reply envelopes, and venous mailing tubes are provided at no charge. |
| Procedural Notes | Two full circles of capillary blood spots should be collected on each filter paper card. |
| | Venous specimens are collected in purple top vacutainer tubes that are supplied by the submitter. |

| Reporting and TAT | Blood Lead results are reported in ug/dL. Turnaround is highly dependent upon receipt of the specimens from the US Postal Service. Specimens are typically delivered to the lab about 8 days after mailing. |
