# **Investigations of Potential Wetland Violations**

## What is a wetland?

A wetland is a water of the state as described in Indiana Code (IC) 13-11-2-265 (a) and (c). IDEM and USACE both have regulatory authority over federally jurisdictional water, also known as Waters of the United States (WOTUS) and IDEM is the regulatory authority over non-jurisdictional waters of the state like state regulated (isolated) wetlands. Wetlands are defined in IC 13-11-2-265.7.

### What is a wetland violation?

- The discharge of fill material into a wetland without authorization violates 327 IAC 2-1-6, which is a rule of the Environmental Rules Board, and thus also violates IC 13-30-2-1(1) and IC 13-18-4-5. IC 13-14-2-2 authorizes IDEM to enter upon private or public property to inspect for and investigate possible violations.
- When investigating potential violations of the discharge of fill material into a wetland without authorization, IDEM utilizes the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Wetland Delineation Manual (Wetlands Research Program Technical Report Y-87) (the Manual) to determine the presence or absence of wetlands on a site.

## IDEM steps to determining the presence of a wetland:

When conducting a site visit to determine the presence or absence of a wetland for the purposes of
evaluating unauthorized placement of fill within a wetland, IDEM staff will collect a datapoint to evaluate
the presence or absence of wetland criteria consistent with the Manual. This process is known as a
wetland determination.

If the datapoint indicates that all three wetland criteria (wetland hydrology, hydrophytic vegetation, and hydric soils) are met, then wetlands are present. Wetlands may also be present without all three wetland criteria due to atypical situations as outlined in the Manual. Atypical situations may include when impacts to a site have already occurred, including clearing and placement of fill. IDEM staff will not conduct a full wetland delineation but will utilize the data point to document the presence or absence of wetland criteria, make a determination, and record the presence or absence of a wetland onsite.

When a wetland is found on the property, the party responsible for the activity will be contacted regarding next steps.
