

On July 1, 2024, the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) Solid Waste Permits Section received an application for a renewal of a Marketing and Distribution Permit from the Town of Winamac, 120 West Main Street, Winamac, IN. The application is a request to allow the marketing and/or distribution of Class A Biosolids generated at the Winamac Wastewater Treatment Plant in Pulaski County. The notice will provide details on how you may appeal IDEM's decision if you disagree with that decision.
