


Classroom Presentations –

Tri-Township Consolidated Schools Using CRGP Award for Recycling Efforts

Tri-Township Consolidated Schools, in LaPorte County, was awarded \$1,027 through IDEM's Community Recycling Grant Program (CRGP). The funding will be used to enhance their recycling program by purchasing recycle bins for classrooms and offices, dual trash and recycling bins for public spaces, and recycling collection carts.

Their recycling program is more than bins, they will also be raising awareness about dealing with today's waste and educating students on sustainability and environmental responsibility.

The CRGP provides funding for schools, universities, counties, municipalities, solid waste management districts, and nonprofit organizations in Indiana. Next funding round is set for summer 2025!

Activity Corner –

Spring is coming, and with spring comes migration!



Spring is a great time to see birds that are migrating through as well as those that are returning for the warmer months. If you are wondering who all those chatty little birds are, the Merlin Bird app from the Cornell Lab of Ornithology can help!

It is a great resource whether you are trying to identify by sight or by sound. You can use the bird wizard function to work step by step through identifying features of a bird you have seen, use the sound ID to determine species by call and record your observations for future reference, and can even try to get an identification by a photo.

Their website is also an excellent resource if you want to learn more about the bird after you get an ID, and also includes K-12 classroom resources, live webcams worldwide, as well as tips and equipment to help you be the best birder you can be!
