On September 29, 1978, United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) established primary and secondary lead standards at a level of 1.5 micrograms per cubic meter ( $ug/m^3$ ) (<u>43 FR 46246</u>). All other areas of Indiana not listed above were designated "attainment/unclassifiable" under the 1978 annual lead standard.

Attainment of the 1978 annual lead standard was determined by evaluating each calendar quarter arithmetic average, which must not exceed 1.5 ug/m<sup>3</sup> over a three-year period.

On October 15, 2008, after reviewing available health science, U.S. EPA lowered the annual lead standards to a level of  $0.15 \text{ ug/m}^3$  and changed the form of the standard to evaluate a rolling three-month average over a three-year period in order to provide to the requisite level of public health and welfare protection (73 FR <u>66964</u>).

All areas of Indiana met the 1978 lead standard at the time it was replaced with the annual 2008 lead standard.
