On September 29, 1978, United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) established annual primary and secondary lead standards at a level of 1.5 micrograms per cubic meter ( $\mu$ g/m³) (43 FR 46246).

On October 15, 2008, after reviewing available science, U.S. EPA lowered the annual lead standards to a level of  $0.15 \,\mu\text{g/m}^3$  ( $73 \,\text{FR} \,66964$ ). All other areas of Indiana not listed above were designated "unclassifiable/attainment" under the 2008 annual lead standard.

Attainment of the 2008 lead standard is determined by evaluating the rolling three-month average. Any maximum (not-to-be-exceeded) rolling three-month average evaluated over a three-year period (three calendar years plus the two previous months) must not exceed  $0.15~\mu g/m^3$ . The three-month average is the average of three consecutive monthly averages (January-March, February-April, March-May, etc.).

On October 18, 2016, after reviewing available science, U.S. EPA concluded that the primary and secondary annual lead standards provided the requisite level of public health and welfare protection, and, therefore retained the existing standards (81 FR 71906).
