

Certification by a third-party helps ensure the diverse status of a business. Although numerous government and other entities offer certification services, we prefer diverse businesses be certified by one or more of the following certifying agencies:

- Women's Business Enterprise National Council (WBENC.org)
- National Veteran Business Development Council (NVBDC.org)
- National LGBT Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC.org)
- Disability:IN (DisabilityIN.org)


