

Can I just purchase whatever my agency needs?

Nope! ③ IDOA is the official procurement agent for all executive branch agencies. Indiana Code 5-22-4-1

State agencies have delegated procurement authority under specific dollar amounts. (less than \$75,000). Those purchases are handled by their Head Procurement Agent (HPA).

Any amount over agency delegation - IDOA Procurement is responsible for the procurement process.





Instructions

Thank you for your interest in bid opportunities with the State of Indiana.

It is imperative to review the sourcing documents to adhere to the submission process specific to each event. Timelines remain critical. Each process requires actions to be taken prior to submission that poses potential risk of delay outside the control of the State and of the Respondent. It is STRONGLY recommended to review and complete the necessary action steps a minimum of ten (10) business days before the event due date(s). A missed submission date will result in a submission being declined.

Supplier Portal Submission

- To access and submit documents, a Bidder registration is required. This includes those wishing to review the event without intention of submitting a response.
- Create/Verify registration Bidder Registration Link
- · After completing the registration tasks, the system completes the registration overnight.
- IMPORTANT NOTE: Registration and/or Updating the required email address used to sign in cannot be done the same day as needing to use the Supplier Portal for document download or submission.
- · Inability to access to the system will not justify a due date extension.



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

Use a PC or laptop to follow these steps:

- · Clear your internet cache and click the Access Supplier Portal button in the Access the Supplier Portal tile.
- On the Sign In with Access Indiana page that has "To use **this system** you must have an Access Indiana account" to the right of the State seal, enter your email address, click Continue and complete the process to authenticate your identity. If you don't already have an Access Indiana account that matches the primary email address on the bidder profile, click the link labeled Don't have an Access Indiana account? instead and follow the steps to create an account and authenticate your identity.
- On the Sign In with Access Indiana page that has "To use **PeopleSoft Supplier** you must have an Access Indiana account" to the right of the State seal, enter your email address, click Continue and complete the process to authenticate your identity.
- Afterwards, you should see the Supplier Secure Home Page displayed.

Background

•The DBE/ACDBE Program was initiated in 1980 by the U.S. Department of Transportation

• Its objectives are

•To ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts in the Department's highway, transit, and airport financial assistance programs
•To create a level playing field on which DBEs can compete fairly for DOT-assisted contracts

- The DBE/ACDBE program is authorized under 49 CFR Parts 26 & 23 respectively
- This program covers three USDOT agencies
 - Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)
 - Federal Transit Administration (FTA)
 - Federal Aviation Administration (FAA

DBE= Disadvantaged Business Enterprise

ACDBE= Airport Concessions Disadvantaged Business Enterprise

DBE Qualifications

A Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) is a for-profit small business that is:

at least 51% owned by one or more individuals who are both **socially** and **economically** disadvantaged

and

whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more of the **socially** and **economically** disadvantaged owners.

- Per 49 CFR 26.65, to qualify as a DBE, the company must be a small business as defined by the Small Business Administration (SBA), which means:
 - The firm's average annual gross receipts may not exceed SBA size standards for its assigned NAICS code(s).
 - In any case, the firm's gross annual receipts may not exceed a \$30.72 million average over the previous three fiscal years.

Do I Qualify?

You must meet the criteria for being both Socially and Economically disadvantaged

- The following are the groups presumed to meet those criteria per 49 CFR 26.5
 - Black Americans
 - Asian-Pacific Americans
 - Hispanic Americans
 - Native Americans
 - Subcontinent Asian-Americans
 - Women
 - Others outside those groups may apply, but they bear the burden of proof to meet both social and economic disadvantage.



Key Final Rule Changes

- Personal Net Worth has been raised to \$2.047 million
 - Excludes retirement assets
- Business size limit has increased from \$30.4 million to \$30.72 million
- You must prove that your business has experience doing the type of work you're seeking certification in







Our Parole Services teams have increased the number of individuals on electronic monitoring. Legislative updates have changed the requirements of electronic monitoring providers. IDOC's contract expires next year, and currently we have posted an RFP for electronic monitoring.








About OPHS

The Office of Public Health and Safety was established in 2016 and is comprised of 5 core divisions that all aim to improve the overall quality of life while addressing the root causes of crime, violence, and behavioral health in Indianapolis communities. The Office convenes public safety and public health agencies along with community partners to execute focused policy efforts in the areas of food security, re-entry, homelessness, violence reduction, and behavioral health.








DEMOGRAPHICS

The Office of Public Health and Safety always strives to celebrate the diversity of its staff, as it serves as a reflection of the city we serve.

A summary (as of 4/1/24)

- Out of our 34 employees, half identify as male, and half identify as female.
- 16 employees (50%) self-identify as Black/of African descent
- Educational backgrounds vary drastically, with the majority of individuals who specified their education level having achieved their Masters degrees
- The majority of office members fall between the 18-35 age range.

We aspire to enhance public awareness and education. We leverage community partners and resources to ensure the highest level of health and safety for all Marion County residents.



COMMUNITY VIOLENCE REDUCTION





In 2021, Mayor Hogsett announced a three-year, \$150 million violence reduction strategy. At the core of this plan is Indy Peace. This partnership between OPHS and the Indy Public Safety Foundation (IPSF) works to identify, connect, and serve individuals at high risk of gun violence.

Indy Peace

Indy Peace is led by those who live in the community to serve those in their community, called Peacemakers. As outreach workers, violence interrupters, and life coaches they work directly with high-risk individuals in communities experiencing violence.

Indy Champions

In 2022, 3,864 people in high domestic violence rate areas received targeted outreach to raise awareness, provide resources, and empower them to build healthy relationships.

Community Based VP Partnership Grants

This OPHS grant is designed to support the existing efforts of local community organizations to address violence and increase safety, especially in those areas of Indianapolis that have experienced recent increases in violent crime.



COMMUNITY VIOLENCE REDUCTION



2024 is a year of large success for the City of Indianapolis. The City of Indy is seeing overall 32% reduction in criminal homicides and a 19% reduction in non-fatal shootings, coinciding with the launch of the Indy Peace and Indy Champions programs.

Among these successes is the Indy Peace initiative, this year they've seen more than **100 participants** and **16 fellows** graduate this June from their intensive 12-18 month program-- past December's group of graduates also saw the first woman to complete the program.







BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Working to increase equitable access to mental health and substance use care in Indianapolis, emphasizing access to treatment and traumainformed crisis response. Removing stigmas by community engagement and education while maintaining the individual's dignity and respect.

Assessment & Intervention Center

- Non-medical, 24/7 voluntary referral linkage facility
- Managed in partnership with Sandra Eskenazi Mental Health Centers, OPHS, and the Community Justice Campus
- Provides free mental health and addiction assessments and referrals

Clinician-Led Community Response Team

- Non-law enforcement, emergency response team
- Comprised of Licensed Clinicians and Peer Specialists
- Responds to 911 calls meeting specific mental-health criteria outlined by emergency services



COMMUNITY NUTRITION & FOOD POLICY

The Division of Community Nutrition and Food Policy is on a mission to build a more equitable, sustainable, and accessible food system for the City of Indianapolis.

Our food team works to:

- Address inequity in the food system, creating an inclusive mechanism to launch and coordinate food policies and programs
- Reduce food insecurity in Indianapolis in a variety of ways
- Empower minority-owned urban farms and grocery stores through
- Fresh Bucks programming
- **Provide food distributions** and cooking demos in partnership with PHA, Gleaners, MCPHD, Midwest Food Bank, IndyGo and others.

Other Programs & Services:

- Indy Food Fund Grant to support local food system initiatives
- Lyft Grocery Access program Offering \$1 Lyft rides to and from SNAP and WICeligible grocery stores for any Marion County Resident - 4 round trips a month by using the code FEEDINDY.



COMMUNITY NUTRITION & FOOD POLICY

Drive and Dish

Drive & Dish is a collaborative effort aimed at addressing food insecurity and health disparities in six zip codes that span three Marion County communities.

This effort was headed and launched by Indiana Pacer's Foundation, the Indianapolis Colts, and the City's Office of Public Health and Safety (OPHS), with funding provided by Indiana Pacers Coach Rick Carlisle, Steve Simon, PS&E, and the Indianapolis Colts. Drive and Dish brings together local organizations including Fresh Connect Central (Gleaners), Nine13 Logistics, HATCH, Christamore House, and Edna Martin (37th Place).



HOMELESSNESS & EVICTION PREVENTION

This Division strives to:

- Address homelessness crisis management
- Mitigate the impacts of eviction by installing teams of navigators and attorneys in eviction courts through the **Tenant Advocacy Project (TAP)**, available to all Indy residents
- Work closely with the Indianapolis Continuum of Care (CoC) to implement the Community's Plan to End Homelessness

Tenant Legal Assistance & Eviction Avoidance

OPHS partners with Indiana Legal Services to provide legal advice to Indy residents facing eviction, with habitability concerns, and with individuals who need assistance with eviction sealing.

Pathway to Employment

Pathway to Employment is a program that connects Indy's unhoused with employment opportunities. Participants in the program are linked with employment by staffing agency, Keys to Work, and are provided with resources and experience that ensure that they can keep and maintain their jobs. In 2023, 104 participants served in Keys to Work, with 73% of participants ending up with full time employment, 22% obtaining housing, and 91% of participants earning their IRC.

Tenant Advocacy Project (TAP)

The Tenant Advocacy Project (TAP) provides attorneys that offer legal advice and representation to tenants with eviction case hearings. Tenant navigators help prepare tenants by gathering documents and information necessary to help attorneys provide precise legal advice. The navigators maintain contact with the tenants, updating new information and giving essential updates on their cases. Most of the tenants served tend to be low-income residents in Indianapolis. Navigators served a total of 432 tenants in 2023, and attorneys assisted 1,232 tenants in 2023.



DIVISION OF

The Reentry Division aims to increase equitable access to resources for the Marion County Reentrant community in an effort to reduce the likelihood of recidivism.

We partner with the Community Justice Campus, PACE, Unite Indy, Neighborhood Christian Legal Clinic, Recycle Force, Fastenal, and others **to provide**:

- 24/7 assistance to connect those individuals exiting the jail with employment, food, and housing assistance, via the Release Lobby at the CJC
- Hosting Community events, such as Expungement Clinics with Neighborhood Christian Legal Clinic
- Driver's License Renewal
- Employment opportunities
- Housing searches
- Access to life coaching









REENTRY

Since January 2024...

OPHS' Reentry Services have assisted 4,474 reentrants through the CJC Release Lobby, with 2,047 seeking the assistance and services offered by the Reentry Division and its partners.

- 488 people have been provided with housing resources
- 435 have been provided employment resources
- **399** have been given food and grocery assistance
- 357 have been given driver's license assistance
- 216 have been provided mental health resources
- 152 have been given substance use assistance

Department of Business & Neighborhood Services (BNS) Introduction

- Sec. 226-101. Department established.
 - There hereby is created a department of business and neighborhood services for the consolidated city as provided by IC 36-3-4-23.
 - (G.O. 41, 2016, §1)
- Four (4) divisions of BNS
 - Administration, Finance and Logistics (AFL)
 - Construction and Business Services (CBS)
 - Property and Land Use Services (PLUS)
 - Animal Care Services (ACS)



Construction and Business Services (CBS)

- The division of construction and business services shall be organized into bureaus and provide the following services:
 - Construction, use, and special event permitting;
 - Business and contractor licensing;
 - Construction inspections; and
 - Weights & measures.



Property and Land Use Services (PLUS)

- The division of property and land use services shall be organized into bureaus and provide the following services:
 - Unsafe building program;
 - High weeds/grass abatement;
 - Illegal dumping/litter abatement;
 - Neighborhood cleanup program; and
 - Business and use inspections.




Animal Care Services (ACS)

- The division of animal care services shall be organized into bureaus and provide the following services:
 - Animal shelter operations;
 - Animal control operations, animal code enforcement; and
 - Animal advocacy and community partnerships.



2023 XBE Spend


