# Introduction to the Indiana APCD

The Indiana All Payer Claims Database (IN APCD) is a large-scale database that collects and aggregates significant amounts of data, including eligibility data, medical claims, pharmacy prescription drug claims, non-fee-for-service information, and health care provider data.

## The purpose of the Indiana APCD is to:

- Identify healthcare needs and inform healthcare policy
- Compare costs between various treatment settings and approaches
- Provide information to consumers and purchasers
- Improve the quality and affordability of patient healthcare and healthcare coverage

# Where Does the Data Come From?

- The IN APCD collects its data from over 30 registered health payers; primarily health insurers and pharmacy benefit managers.
- These entities are mandated by statute to submit eligibility, provider, medical & pharmacy claims data to the IN APCD and are defined by (IC 27-1-44.5-2)





# What Years Does the Data Cover?



- As of 03/26/2024, data within the IN APCD encompasses paid claims with a paid date from between January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020, through to February 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- These dates represent historical catch-up data from January 2020, through July 2023, followed by monthly submissions from our submitters.
- Accessible data encompasses paid claims from January 1<sup>st</sup> 2020, through December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023.



# What's *NOT* Included in the IN APCD?

## Military Claims:

- Military healthcare claims are typically handled through the VA, or TriCare. Indiana does not currently have an agreement with the Department of Defense to collect these claims.

## Clinical Data (Chart Notes, Lab Results, Imaging Results):

- The IN APCD currently **only** collects claims data from Eligibility, Provider, Medical and Pharmacy claims. While we would be interested in integrating Clinical Data for comparative analysis, we do not have the capabilities currently.

## Uninsured Persons / Cash Prices:

- Because of the nature of the IN APCD, the data we're receiving comes straight from the insurers. As a result, if there is not an accompanying insurance claim for a service rendered, we're unable to see those service details.

# What Else is *NOT* Included...

## Churches:

- Churches often employ a small number of individuals, and this low volume often falls into Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services' (CMS) Cell Suppression Standards.

## Dental:

- Dental claims are specifically listed as an exclusion within Indiana Statute for submitting claims to the IN APCD.

## Claim Denials:

- While we do request that our submitters send us adjustments to claims, initially denied claims are generally not submitted to us.

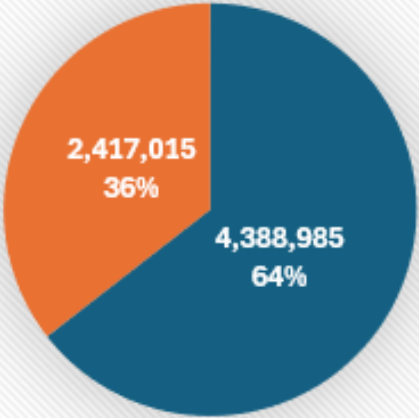

# IN APCD Population Breakdown

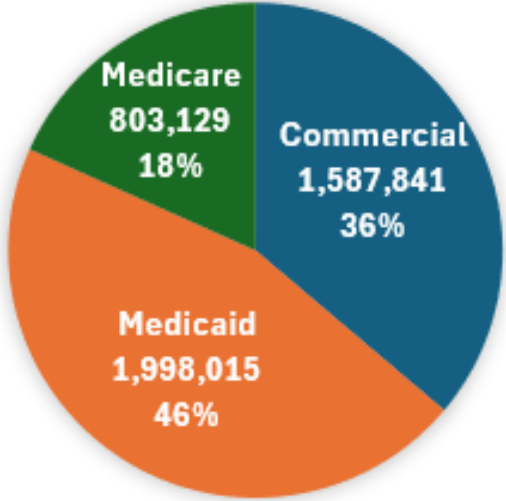
## Unique Members with at least 1 Medical Claim in IN-APCD

(Medicare + Medicaid): 522,486

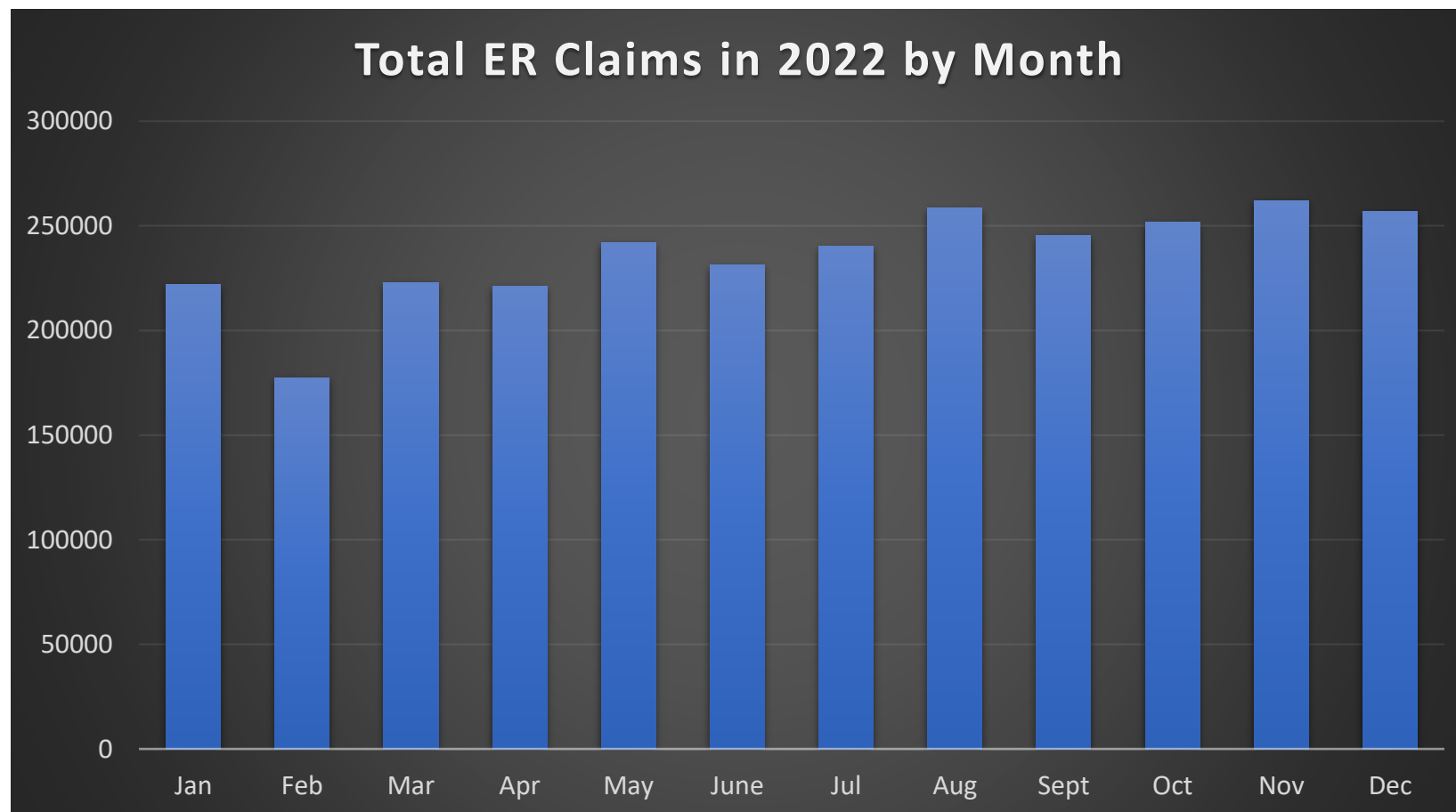




# IN APCD Data by the Numbers

**Methodology:** All unique ER claims for CPT codes 99281 – 99285. Includes both facility & provider claims. Does not factor if a “visit” only has a professional claim & not an accompanying facility claim.

- Displays the 25 most prescribed drugs in the state
- Amounts consumers and insurance pay overall
- Average total cost for each claim

The Indiana APCD Consumer-Facing Website contains two unique dashboards which highlight some of the data within our database. The Indiana Healthcare Price & Quality Comparison Tool groups common medical visits & procedures with two interactive views: Procedures & Imaging, and Office Visits & Labs.



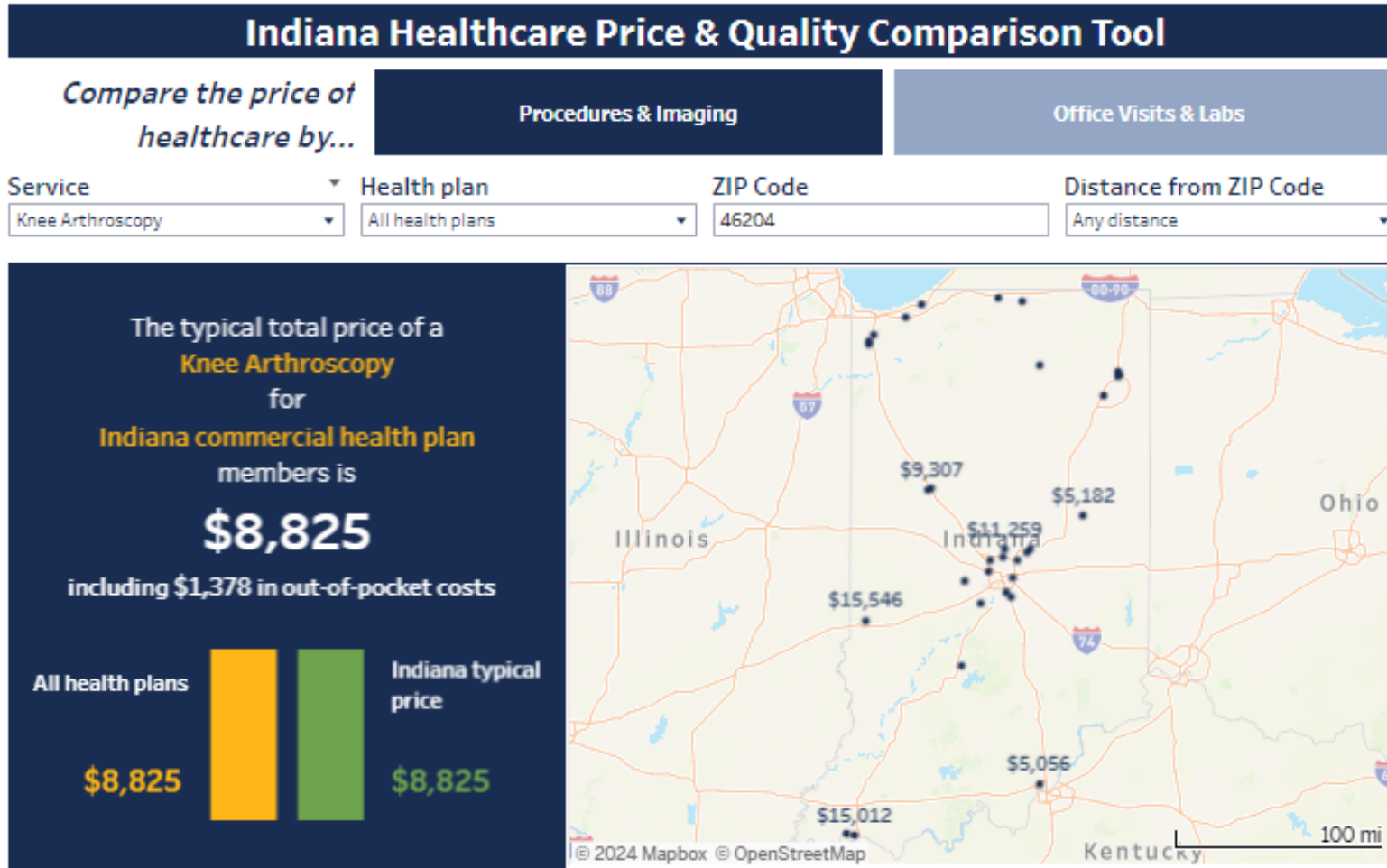


# Procedures & Imaging Dashboard

- Displays 50+ of the most common medical & imaging procedures.
- Displays the typical total price for a procedure at a given facility.
- Displays facilities on an interactive map, with accuracy down to the street level.
- Showcases number of visits at each facility (Volume).
- Displays the typical cost of a procedure and the price range at a facility for a given health plan.



# Procedures & Imaging

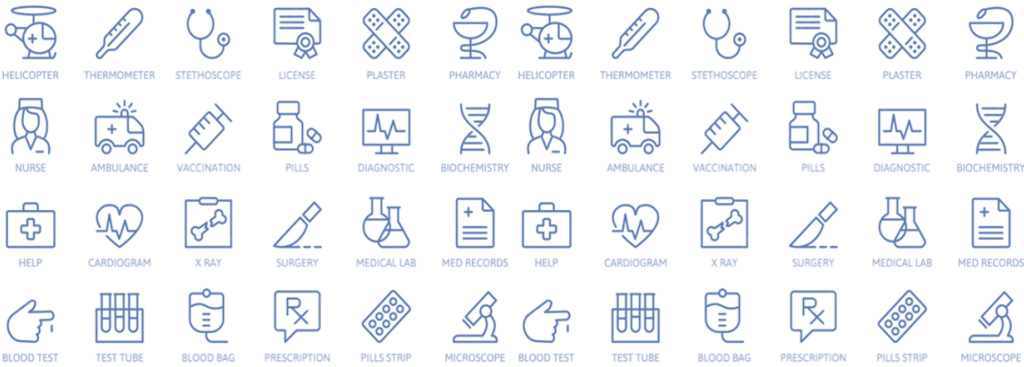


The Procedures & Imaging dashboard displays the typical (average) total cost and out-of-pocket cost for selected procedures within Indiana.

- Users can immediately see various facility locations throughout the state.
- Users can click on individual markers to highlight specific facilities.
- Users can zoom into the map down to the street level thanks to precise geolocation.
- *Not shown:* Users can also see CMS quality ratings (where available) for each facility.

# Office Visits & Labs Dashboard

- Shows some of the most common office visits & diagnostic labs by county
- Shows the typical out of pocket cost for a given service across the state and each county.
- Shows the typical price range for a visit for a given county
- Shows how many visits are performed within a given county per year

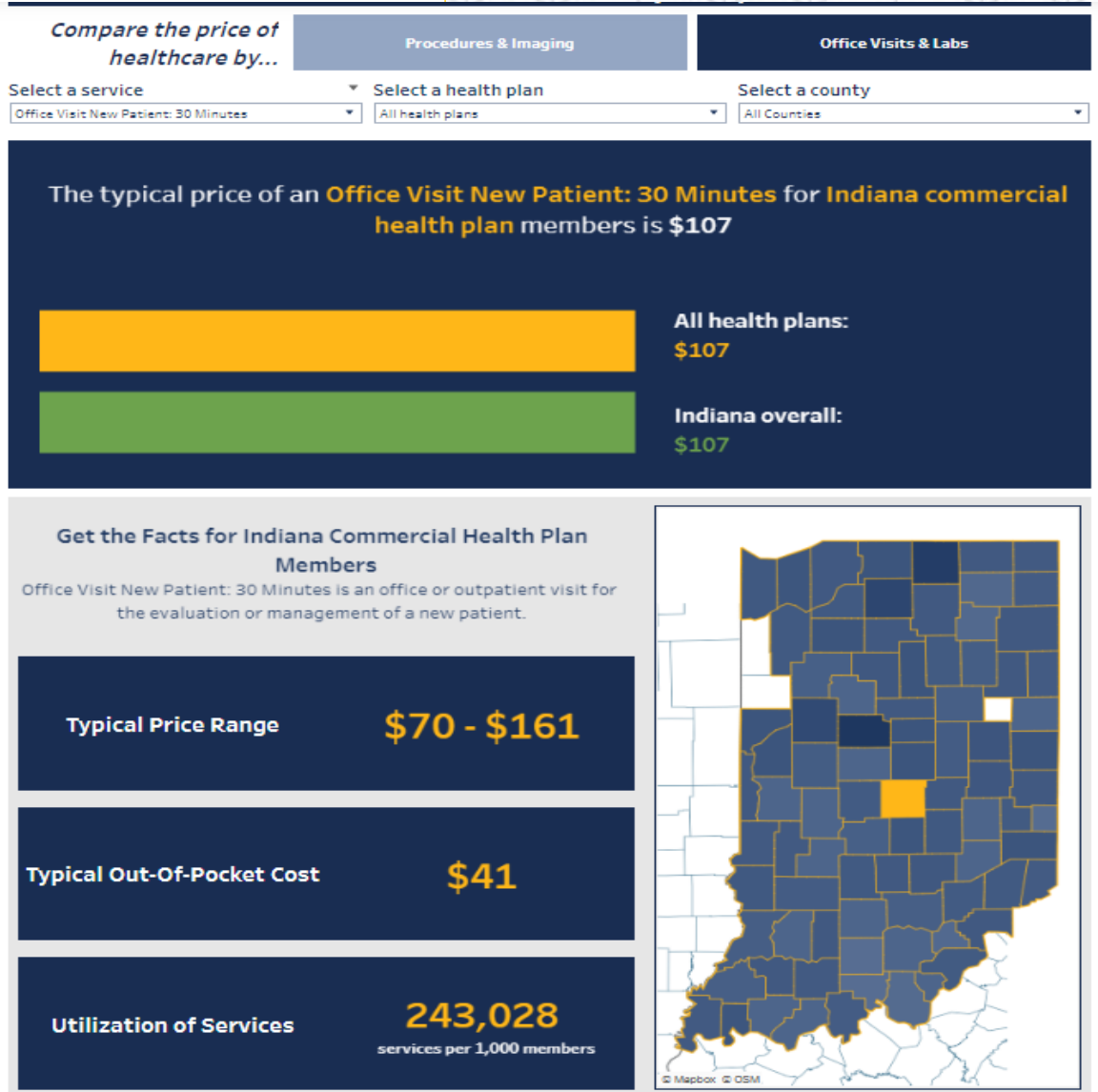




# Office Visits & Labs

The **Office Visits and Labs** dashboard highlights utilization & costs for professional visits. This dashboard is organized by county.

- Due to billing practices, office visits & lab services make it harder to identify the precise location where service is rendered
- *Place of service* on the claim line level is often listed as the providers billing office. To address this; data has been grouped by county.
- While cost typically does not fluctuate by county, this dashboard highlights that utilization *does*.
