## PRELIMINARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF LICENSE DENIAL

The Indiana Department of Insurance ("Department"), pursuant to the Indiana Administrative Orders and Procedures Act, Indiana Code § 4-21.5-1 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12, hereby gives notice to Sylias Haggard ("Applicant") of the following Administrative Order:

- 1. Applicant submitted an application for a resident producer license with the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Insurance ("Commissioner") on August 5, 2024.
- 2. Before approving an application, the Commissioner must find that the applicant has met specific requirements under Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-6 and Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12.
- 3. Following a review of public records and the material submitted by Applicant, the Commissioner, being fully advised, now hereby notifies Applicant that Applicant has not fully met the requirements of licensure, as stated by Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) due to Applicant's disclosed felony convictions including:

- October 7, 2019, Domestic Battery in the presence of a child less than 16
   years old, a Level 6 Felony, in the State of Indiana;
- b. November 25, 2019, Battery by Means of a Deadly Weapon, a Level 5 Felony, in the State of Indiana; and
- c. November 27, 2023, Battery by Bodily Waste, a Level 6 Felony, in the State of Indiana.
- 4. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) states, in part, that the Commissioner may refuse to issue an insurance producer's license for having been convicted of a felony.
- 5. Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(d) provides that the applicant may, not more than sixty-three (63) days after notice of denial of the applicant's application is mailed, make written demand to the Commissioner for a hearing before the Commissioner to determine the reasonableness of the Commissioner's action.
- 6. This is considered an administrative action by the Indiana Department of Insurance. If you choose to appeal this administrative action, please follow the aforementioned instructions. Subsequently, after the Department has received your written request for a hearing, the State of Indiana Office of Administrative Law Proceedings ("OALP") will assign an administrative law judge to preside over this matter, and you will receive more information from OALP to begin the administrative process.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request for licensure is hereby DENIED pursuant to Indiana Code § 27-1-15.6-12(b)(6) due to Applicant's felony convictions.
