I. ALJs

ALJs are hearing examiners who are appointed to unfair practice cases pursuant to Ind. Code Ch. 20-29-7.

2. Other Ad Hoc ALJs (who are either not state employees or state employees not working on state time) receive \$1,200.00 per day (7.5 hours) on a prorated basis plus costs pursuant to State of Indiana guidelines.

II. Other Neutral Appointees

- A. Aside from ALJs, IEERB appoints
 - 1. Hearing Officers for representation cases, pursuant to Ind. Code Ch. 20-29-5;
 - 2. Fact-Finders for impasse cases, pursuant to Ind. Code Chs. 20-29-6 and 20-29-8; and
 - 3. Compliance Officers for compliance cases, pursuant to Ind. Code § 20-29-6-6.1.
- B. Appointees must be on IEERB's staff or ad hoc panel (https://www.in.gov/ieerb/about-ieerb/ad-hocsaljsfactfinders/). All Fact-Finders must have attended IEERB impasse training. Many appointees have extensive experience in education, labor, and/or administrative law.
