


Households Assisted by Agency



The Energy Assistance Program (EAP) is a federally funded program through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) called the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). EAP provides a one-time annual benefit that can assist homeowners and renters with the high cost of home energy and can help if utilities are disconnected or are about to get disconnected.

The EAP program is administered in partnership with local service providers (LSPs). LSPs process all applications; to apply in-person or request a paper application form, applicants must contact their Local Service Provider.
