Instructor Dan Zsido retired as a lieutenant from the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office in 2016 after 34 years of service. He was the commander of the Narcotics Division comprised of the Pinellas Initiative with the Central Florida HIDTA, Strategic Interdiction, Tactical, Diversion, and Technical Operations with over 50 detectives, 8 law enforcement agencies, analysts, and civilian personnel. Mr. Zsido has held various assignments and positions during his career as an investigator and supervisor in Patrol Operations, SWAT, FTO, Street Crimes Unit, Community Policing, and In 2009 he was selected to establish and Narcotics. supervise a Strategic Diversion Task Force wherein he developed a nationally recognized multi-agency entity that investigated pharmaceutical crimes such as doctor shopping, prescription fraud, drug trafficking organizations, rouge pharmacies, and pill mill criminal enterprises. Mr. Zsido has served as the NADDI Education and Training Coordinator since 2016. He is an active board director with the Pinellas NOPE (Narcotics Overdose Prevention and Education) and DFAF (Drug Free America Foundation). On a national level he provides impactful narcotic training and drug trend awareness to law enforcement, corrections, probation and parole, regulatory investigators, healthcare practitioners, schools, community groups, anti-drug coalitions, HIDTAs, and the National Guard. Mr. Zsido has a Bachelor degree in Business Administration from Tampa College and is a graduate of the DEA Narcotics course.
