CHALLENGE PROCESS GOALS

The Challenge Process is the Indiana Broadband Office's opportunity to gather the most accurate data possible before awarding BEAD funds to internet service providers.



Crowdsources evidence to ensure the IBO can identify all unserved and underserved locations.



Ensures that those who know their communities best can provide accurate information and help the IBO best allocate its resources.



Provides the IBO with a comprehensive list of eligible locations before beginning subgrantee selection.



WHAT IS THE REBUTTAL PHASE?

- The rebuttal phase is an opportunity for permissible challengers to review challenged locations and submit rebuttal evidence if they believe a challenge to be incorrect.
- All permissible challengers can participate in the rebuttal phase.
- Provider service level challenges can only be rebutted by the challenged internet service provider.
 - Ex: Availability, speed, business service only.
- All other challenges can be rebutted by any permissible challenger.
 - Ex: Planned/existing service, enforceable commitment, location is a CAI

REBUTTAL PROCESS FLOW



PREPARING FOR REBUTTALS

- Permissible challengers can review challenges against them and challenges that all challengers can respond to
- Challengers can see the following information about each challenge:
 - Locations being challenged (and if any locations in original challenge were rejected)
 - Challenge type
 - Entity that submitted the challenge
 - The provider being challenged (if applicable)
 - The technology being challenged (if applicable)
- Permissible challenger cannot see the challenge evidence submitted

PREPARING FOR REBUTTALS

- Permissible challengers will submit rebuttals by challenge and can choose to rebut only certain locations from each challenge
- Using the same evidence for multiple rebuttals is acceptable, but the evidence will need to be submitted for each applicable challenge
- Rebuttal evidence will not be reviewed until the Final Determination phase – if you have questions about minimally acceptable evidence, please reach out to the IBO
 - Even if a challenger submits sufficient rebuttal evidence, the challenge evidence submitted may still outweigh the rebuttal evidence

PROVIDER SERVICE LEVEL - ONLY CHALLENGED PROVIDERS CAN REBUT

	Description	Example Evidence
Availability	If rebutting an availability challenge, you are submitting evidence that service at or above 100/20 is available at the location for a standard installation fee and within 10 days of a request.	 A copy of the customer's bill A screenshot of your website showing that the service is available Proof of correspondence with the customer that shows service is now available A map showing that the address is clearly within the service area

PROVIDER SERVICE LEVEL - ONLY CHALLENGED PROVIDERS CAN REBUT

	Description	Required Evidence
Speed	If rebutting a speed challenge, you must have countervailing speed test evidence showing sufficient speeds at or above 100/20	Proof of three speed tests taken on three different days

PROVIDER SERVICE LEVEL - ONLY CHALLENGED PROVIDERS CAN REBUT

	Description	Example Evidence
Business Service Only	If rebutting a business service only challenge, you are submitting evidence that residential service is also available at the location.	 Any evidence that the service listed in the BDC is available at the location and marketed to consumers A screenshot of the provider website showing that residential service is available A copy of correspondence with the location that includes an offer for residential service

ALL PERMISSIBLE CHALLENGERS CAN REBUT

	Description	Example Evidence
Enforceable Commitment	If rebutting an enforceable commitment challenge, you are submitting evidence that the provider will be unable to meet the commitment.	 Any documentation that the provider has defaulted on the commitment Any documentation that the provider is not building out the commitment to a BEAD-sufficient level Any documentation that the provider is otherwise unable to meet the commitment

ALL PERMISSIBLE CHALLENGERS CAN REBUT


	Description	Example Evidence
Planned or Existing Service	If rebutting a planned or existing service challenge, you are providing evidence that the provider does not serve that location or is no longer planning to build to that location.	 Any documentation that the provider is no longer planning that deployment Any documentation that the deployment will not be complete by June 30, 2024 Any documentation that the deployment will not meet the required technology or performance requirements

ALL PERMISSIBLE CHALLENGERS CAN REBUT

	Description	Example Evidence
Location is a CAI	If rebutting a CAI challenge, you are providing evidence that the location is not actually a community anchor institution.	 Any evidence that the location does not fall within the definitions of a CAI set by the IBO Any evidence that the location is no longer in operation


