A written report of the assessment of damages shall be mailed to the aggrieved party and the department by first class United States mail. If either the department or the aggrieved party is not satisfied with the assessment of damages, either or both may file a petition, not later than fifteen (15) days after receiving the report, in the circuit or superior court of the county in which the land or water is located.




The following is summary of the discussion, comments and action items from the meeting:

- Project team commenced meeting providing aerial imagery figures, project plans, and an informational inquiry form.
- The landowners expressed concerns with the current speed along SR 37, as well as the poor site distance along Notestine Road at the crossing.
  - The landowners would have impacted properties on both sides of SR 37 and requested looking into a reduction in the footprint, specifically suggesting pulling the alignment in north toward Notestine Road.
- Associated work/projects:
  - The project team detailed a planned project along SR 37 programmed further into the future that is looking to widen the shoulders.
  - The landowners detailed a need for wider shoulders that could accommodate buggies or a designated buggy lane.
  - The landowners detailed knowledge of a future utility project (overhead electrical line replacement) along Notestine Road that would impact their property.
- Concerns with surveying and property access
  - o A majority of the survey footprint is within the fenced pastures of the property.
  - O The landowners expressed concerns with accessing the pastures and remaining boring holes proceeding the survey work.
    - The pastures contain sheep and horses, and the property owners would like to ensure that all who access exercise diligent entrance/exit methods into pastures to prevent livestock exiting.
    - Once borings are completed, there is a need to backfill the holes with sand/stone/other backfill to mitigate the risk of livestock injuries.
- The project team detailed the public information meeting that is anticipated to be held in early February 2024.

The following is summary of the discussion, comments and action items from the meeting:

- Project team commenced meeting providing aerial imagery figures, project plans, and an informational inquiry form.
- Notestine Road was detailed as the major east-west thoroughfare for the local Amish community.
- There was a collective agreement among the non-project team attendees that speeds along SR 37 at this location need to be reduced (and enforced) to increase safety regardless of the interchange improvement.
- Attendees questioned other intersection improvement design alternatives:
  - o A 4-way stop (both signed and signalized intersections)
  - A roundabout
  - o The project team detailed the INDOT process for analyzing alternatives and reasoned why certain alternatives were initially dismissed (i.e. safety, ROW impacts, etc.), but that these additional design alternatives would be considered moving forward.
- It was suggested that the project alignment be pulled to the north toward Notestine Road and impact the property at the southeast corner of the intersection, which would reduce the overall farmland impacts and bisection. The project team requested that adjacent landowners provide contact information to this other landowner who was not in attendance in order to initiate further discussions.
- The property owner at the northwest corner of the intersection stated that a cul-de-sac would be needed west of SR 37 to facilitate trucks and semis that access the property for business.

Hi Cassidy - I briefly thanked you after your presentation on Tuesday evening 2/27 at the Harlan Park Community Center. Here is my feedback:



I appreciate all the work that was put into the evaluation of this intersection and the various options. I believe the one selected is the best and the least confusing. For 30 years, I passed through this intersection twice a day, five times a week - turning from the east and heading southbound in the AM, and passing from the west to the east across the intersection in the PM. That amounts to just over 7500 interactions with the intersection in both the AM and in the PM. Unfortunately, approximately 7 years ago I was in a property damage accident. Heading east and crossing the intersection I had missed an oncoming car from the north. Even though I looked each way twice, my vision was blocked by the A-post on my side.

As a volunteer medic with Northeast Fire District, I have been at several accident scenes. As in my case, there are a number of accidents due to driver error.

I agree the intersection is more dangerous due to it being skewed and hope this solution will reduce the number of incidents by correcting / eliminating the following:

- The northeast corner has visual obstructions due to a farm fence and a utility (gas line?) marker.
- The southeast corner has the small house with large number of construction vans and trailers
  - Several years ago these vehicles were pulling directly into the intersection instead of SR 37 or Notestine. I was able to contact an ISP officer who knew the owner of the construction outfit and a rope/wire fence was put up
  - However, on Monday, 2/26 I was attempting to cross the intersection and a pickup owned by the resident of the house was along 37 waiting to pull onto the roadway and obstructing my view, so I had to wait to pull out
- Another issue that I was involved in a couple of years ago involved a pickup attempting to pass
  me and other vehicles who had slowed to allow a buggy ahead of us to turn left. Luckily I saw
  him in time and was able to safely 'block' him from passing. I reported this to INDOT and was
  successful in getting double yellow lines painted (there had been none before) and signs
  posted
  - Please be certain the double yellow lines and signage are part of the revision

Again, thank you for the great job you did at the presentation!



Between 2016-2023, there were 42 crashes at the intersection; two fatal crashes and 12 crashes with injury




Notestine Road has a significant skew that causes sight distance issues, contributing to the number of crashes





### **PROJECT DESCRIPTION:**
