PROJECT OVERVIEW

Project Location

• The project is located on SR 8 in Auburn, Indiana.

Project Purpose

The purpose of this project is to improve the safety and mobility of SR 8
from just east of the I-69 interchange to just east of the SR 8 and
Grandstaff Drive intersection.

Proposed Design

 Our proposed design will add a center-raised median; make intersection improvements at SR 8 and Touring Drive and at SR 8 and Grandstaff
 Drive; add pedestrian sidewalks along both sides of SR 8; and improve drainage along the corridor.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS

- Categorical Exclusion Level 2
- Environmental Assessment released for public involvement May 31, 2024

Land Use

- Acquisition of 1.23 acres for permanent right of way
- Temporary utilization of 0.86 acres for construction purposes

Ecological Considerations

- Impact on 0.04 acres of wetland to improve existing drainage along the roadway
- No adverse effects on waterways or streams
- Impacts to threatened and endangered bat species will be minimized with tree clearing time-of-year restrictions

Community and Environmental Health

- No adverse effects on the local community or air quality
- Monitoring wells are within project area coordination with Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) will occur

PROJECT STUDY AREA

SR 8 Corridor

- East of I-69 to East of Grandstaff Drive
- SR 8 & Touring Drive intersection
- SR 8 & West Edge Drive intersection
- SR 8 & Grandstaff Drive intersection





PROJECT PURPOSE & NEED

Purpose:

Improve mobility and safety for vehicles and pedestrians


• Need:

- High crash frequency and severity
- Congestion during peak traffic periods
- Sidewalks missing in several areas throughout corridor





CRASH FREQUENCY & SEVERITY [3 Year Period]





WHAT'S CAUSING CRASHES?

Congestion

- Rear-end crashes represent:
 - 53% at Touring Drive
 - 69% at Grandstaff Drive
- Few gaps in traffic to make left turns entering/exiting SR 8

29 commercial drives between Touring and Grandstaff Drive

- Drivers must cross 3 lanes to turn left from drives
- Aggressive Driving
- Approx. 79% of the 97 total crashes along SR 8 between Touring Drive & Grandstaff Drive were either right-angle or turning crashes

Existing Condition





PROJECT ALTERNATIVES & PREFERRED DESIGN

- Alternatives considered for analysis:
 - Center Curb and <u>3</u> U-Turns
 - No Build

- Preferred design:
 - Center Curb and <u>5</u> U-Turns





CENTER CURB & 3 U-TURNS (ALTERNATIVE)



- PRO Minimized left turn movements between Touring Drive and Grandstaff Drive
- PRO Narrower cross section, less need for widening to incorporate additional U-turn locations
- CON Increases U-turn traffic at heavily utilized signalized intersections of Touring Drive and Grandstaff Drive impacting operations
- **CON** Restricts access to and from commercial drives
- **CON** Increases traffic rerouting





- PRO Minimizes impacts to existing signalized intersections at Touring Drive and Grandstaff Drive
- PRO Restricts access to commercial drives while still providing flexibility for movements
- PRO Minimizes traffic rerouting
- CON Wider cross section given the need for U-turn bump outs and the development of the right turn lane on the south side of SR 8





- Add Raised Center Curb with 3 median openings between Touring Dr and Grandstaff Dr
- Improve access by adding right turn lane
- Add/Replace ADA compliant sidewalks along both sides of SR 8
- Consolidate driveway access to businesses




SR 8 & Touring Drive Intersection Improvements

- Add Right Turn Lanes
 - Eastbound to Southbound
 - Northbound to Eastbound
- Add 2nd Left Turn Lane
 - Northbound to Westbound






SR 8 & West Edge Drive Intersection Improvements

PROPOSED PRIVATE DEVELOPMENT

Proposed Private Development South of SR 8:

- Connect SR 8 to W 15th Street via
 Connection Drive
- Connect Touring Drive to Connection
 Drive via Fortify Drive






ACCESS MANAGEMENT

Access management seeks balance between the safety and mobility of a roadway with the access needs of neighboring properties.








EXAMPLE: Northcrest Shopping Center on Coliseum Blvd. near Clinton Street in Fort Wayne.

Benefits

- Reduce angle crashes between major intersections
- Improve traffic flow
- Encourage consistent speeds
- Promote safer driving




Existing Condition

TRAFFIC DURING CONSTRUCTION




How will traffic be managed during construction?

- SR 8 Reduced to one lane in each direction with a center two way left turn lane
- Built in Phases: Phase 1: South side construction | Phase 2: North side construction | Phase 3: Center curb construction
- Access to businesses will be maintained via temporary drives and/or alternate routes


