Winter Reliability and Preparedness

<u>Assets</u>

- Peak day system design minus 17 $^\circ$ F
- Four interstate pipelines
- Looped transmission system
- On-system storage and peaking





Coordination Activities

- Active communications with key stakeholders
 - Natural gas suppliers
 - Third-party marketers
 - Power generation customers
 - Interstate Pipelines

Highlighted 2024 Activity

Transmission Assets

- Performed external corrosion direct assessment (ECDA) on 24.05 miles of pipe this past year with 4 integrity digs
- Hydrostatically tested 13.18 miles of transmission pipe
- 42.79% complete on Maximum Allowable Operating Pressure (MAOP) reconfirmation
- Installed alternating current (AC) mitigation measures on 1.2 miles of transmission main

Highlighted 2024 Activity

Storage Assets

- Retrofitted and completed baseline integrity assessments on 25 storage wells
- Completed the installation of a secondary glycol tower in Worthington station


Distribution Assets

- Replaced 2.29 miles of the remaining 4.7 miles of cast iron pipe installed in the 1950s
- Upgraded odorant equipment in southeast part of system to increase reliability and reduce frequency of refilling

Supply Reliability




2024-25 Retail Load Duration Curve

Citizens contracts to meet its firm demand requirements on a peak day and a severe season.


Citizens utilizes a mix of firm transportation, storage, and peaking to meet projected demands.

2024 Storage Injections


On-system and contracted storage inventories will be full to meet winter demands.




Winter 2024-2025 Supply Mix




