

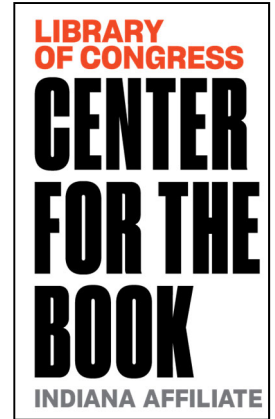

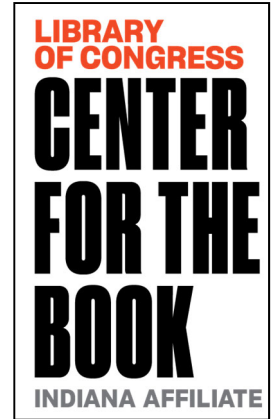

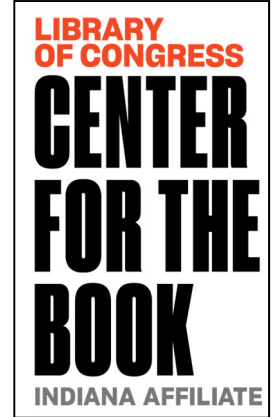

In Indiana, learning comes from a variety of forms, and there is something for everyone. It doesn't matter who you are, or what you like, you are sure to love learning in Indiana!



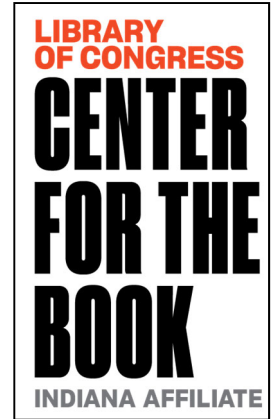
