Gale Completes Lineup of AccessMyLibrary Apps

AccessMyLibrary
App by Gale

Gale recently released the College and School editions of the AccessMyLibrary (AML) Android applications, which join the AML School Edition application for the iPad that became available in early January. These latest additions complete Gale's line-up of AML applications, which make Gale library resources accessible on the go from all major mobile devices.

AML College and School Edition ask students to locate their school and then authenticate for the year. Both editions require a one-time password. College students can enter their school-issued email address to have the password sent to them, while students in grade, middle and high schools will have the password provided by their institution. Rather than sifting through internet sites that aren't always reliable, students can access credible library reference sources available via INSPIRE in seconds with AML apps.

Additionally, Quick Response (QR) codes are available for all AML apps. After downloading a QR code-scanning app, mobile phone users can scan the AML QR code with their barcode reader to be automatically taken to the Gale apps web site.

AML apps can be downloaded from the iTunes store and Android Marketplace. All AML apps are free and additional information, including QR codes, posters, bookmarks and other library marketing resources can be found at

This change will affect all NetLibrary collections purchased by your library and the Indiana Shared eBook Collection on INSPIRE. In particular, the collection offers professional development resources that offer insight into writing effective r sum s, learning simple and advanced computer skills and career guidance and job effectiveness strategies. Additionally, the collection contains extensive medical and personal health holdings from topics on diet and weight loss to information of all aspects of physical and mental health.

One Week Remains to Join Gateway Trainers Project
