### **New Legislation Paves Way for State Library Foundation**

Governor Mitch Daniels recently signed Senate Bill 485 into law authorizing the Indiana Library & Historical Board (ILHB) to establish a nonprofit foundation to solicit and

accept tax-deductible contributions. The foundation will raise funds to support the Indiana State Library and statewide library services that benefit the Indiana library community.

"The Foundation will enhance current statewide library services and aid in the development of innovative new programs," Brooker added. "I would like to thank Senator Gard, Governor Daniels and the Indiana General Assembly for passing this important legislation that will embolden the statewide library community's efforts toward being a national leader in the provision of library services."

# **LSTA Update**

As part of the budget deal approved by Congress two weeks ago, total 2011 funding for the Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS) was cut from \$282 million to \$238 million. By far the largest IMLS program is the LSTA Grants to States program. Indiana's 2011 final allocation will be determined IMLS, which must decide how the reduced funding will be distributed among all its programs. IMLS has 30 days to decide on the distribution of the cuts...learn more

The ILHB and State Library will soon begin laying the groundwork for the future foundation and identifying new opportunities, including grants and sponsorships, for which it was previously ineligible. According to the bill authored by Senator Beverly Gard (R-Greenfield), the Foundation must be governed by a board of directors and undergo an annual audit by the State Board of Accounts. The bill goes into effect July 1, 2011.
