

Indiana Gov. Eric Holcomb on Dec. 6 issued a proclamation declaring that day to be Indiana State Library Bicentennial Day, highlighting the importance of the Indiana State Library. The library became a state agency in 1825 and has since served as the primary research library for state government and as the official depository for state publications. It also plays a vital role in preserving the history and culture of Indiana.

In celebration of its 200th anniversary as a state agency, the library has several activities and events planned for 2025. On Tuesday, Feb. 11, 2025, an invitation-only celebration will take place at the Indiana State Library marking the anniversary of the day that the library became a state agency. Throughout the year, the library will administer multiple trivia and escape room events, host a special bicentennial Lunch and Learn program, exhibit and display several items from its

PLAC fee to change in 2025

2025 PLAC FEE \$70



The Indiana Library and Historical Board voted unanimously on Dec. 6 to change the cost of the Public Library Access Card from \$65 to \$70, effective Jan. 1, 2025. Indiana Center for the Book and is centered around reading and writing.

Students are asked to read a book, poem or speech and write to the author - living or deceased - about how the book affected how they see themselves or how they see the world. Indiana students in grades four through 12 are eligible to enter the Letters About Literature reading and writing contest.

There are three competition levels: Level I, for grades four through six; Level II, for grades seven and eight; and Level III, for grades nine through 12. Prizes are awarded to the following winners in each level: first place will win \$100; second place will win \$50; and third place will win \$30. Additionally, \$50 will be awarded to the highest scored letter written to an Indiana author and \$150 will be awarded to a teacher who has gone the extra mile to support their students in entering the contest. Beginning in 2025, the Indiana State Library will house all of the newspaper master microfilm reels created by the Indiana Archives and Records Administration's state imaging and microfilm lab. The merged newspaper microfilm master reels collection will be managed by the State Library. Those who would like more information about ordering microfilm should contact <u>David Pleiss</u>, newspaper librarian at the Indiana State Library.

Those interested in accessing digitized Indiana newspapers can visit <u>Hoosier State Chronicles</u> or use Newspapers.com via <u>INSPIRE</u> for free access to digitized Indiana newspapers. The PLAC program allows library patrons to purchase a card which permits them to borrow materials directly from any public library in Indiana.

Any individual who holds a valid Indiana public library card may obtain a card. The cost of the card is \$70 and each card is valid for 12 months after being issued.

The Indiana State Library collects the revenue from the sale of these cards and places it in a designated fund account for the PLAC program. After the end of the calendar year, all of the money collected is distributed back to libraries on the basis of net loans. The submission deadline is Jan. 21, 2025.

Winners will be announced in late March of 2025. They will also receive an invitation to the Virtual Awards Ceremony, as well as a prize pack -including free books - mailed to their home. All winning letters are published in a book that is distributed free to the winning students. The guest author for the Virtual Awards Ceremony will be Indiana author Lisa Fipps.
