After a long-anticipated renovation and expansion,
Wabash Carnegie Public Library has announced its grand reopening on Friday, Nov. 15. The celebration will begin with a ribbon-cutting ceremony at 1 p.m., followed by an open house featuring light refreshments, tours of the new building, giveaways and more. The entire community is invited to attend and explore the newly updated and expanded library.

The project, which began in March of 2023, has transformed the library into a modern, vibrant community hub. Key improvements include meeting rooms, a children's programming space, genealogy room and flexible study spaces. The updated library is designed to better meet the needs of the community while continuing to offer the welcoming, inclusive environment that patrons have come to love.

Jon Gaskill, executive director of the Wabash Carnegie Public Library, expressed excitement about the reopening by quoting the late Andrew Carnegie. "There is not such a cradle of democracy upon the earth as the free public library, this republic of letters, where neither rank, office, nor wealth receives the slightest consideration." He went on to explain, "As this quote suggests, the public library is here for everyone, regardless of race, creed, color or identity. Regardless of where you have been or where you are going, we are here for you, for the community. This newly

America250, and other federal partners and cultural heritage organizations. For anyone unfamiliar with the term "semiquincentennial," it literally means half of a quincentennial, thus making it a 250th anniversary.

The new website will serve as an anchor to NARA's Declaration250-related activities over the next two years. Currently the site features signature programming and a countdown to July 4, 2026. It also points to a wide range of related National Archives resources, including an America's Founding Documents page on the <u>Declaration of Independence</u> and a Calendar of Events. created in March 2022 by the
Indiana General Assembly. The

outlining important state and
national historical events, a 250th
anniversary celebration on July 4,
2026, at the Indiana War Memorial
in Indianapolis and a torch relay
that reaches all 92 Indiana counties.
