By offering a flexible, cost-effective alternative to existing commercial software, PEARL will provide academic institutions with a powerful tool to enhance student access to learning materials.

With the rising costs of higher education, many students struggle to afford textbooks and other required materials. Library-based reading lists, like those that PEARL will facilitate, offer a solution by providing students with free access to essential course materials. This not only eases financial burdens but also helps improve student outcomes by ensuring all students have the resources they need to fully engage with their coursework.

"We are excited to take this step toward building a sustainable, open-source library service platform that can be widely adopted," says Noah Brubaker, PALNI associate director. "PEARL will not only save students money by reducing the need for costly textbooks but will also ensure that all students have equitable access to the materials they need to succeed in their courses."

The film stars Jack Buetel, Jane Russell, Thomas Mitchell and Walter Huston. It was Russell's debut role showcasing her as a "sex symbol." The Hollywood Production Code Administration ordered cuts to particular scenes and 20th Century Fox wanted to cancel the release of the film because of the provocative portrayal of Russell's character.

North Webster Community Public Library Launches 'Scary Stuff Series'

This October, the North Webster Community Public Library is offering a new program series that goes beyond ghosts and goblins, tackling real-life concerns in a modern world. The "Scary Stuff Series" will focus on practical ways to protect people from today's hidden dangers. streets - and in Fort Wayne on Calhoun Street - but the name of "Mr. Ruffino" from the broadside could not be identified in Indiana or in Hollywood.

Hughes' response to the endangerment of his film was to manufacture public objection for "The Outlaw" to be banned as an obscene film to generate equal demand for the film's release. Church leaders and women's clubs were contacted and baited, which eventually led to the involvement of the Legion of Decency, who "condemned" the picture.


In 1943, the film played for seven weeks in San Francisco, but after that, further deals with 20th Century Fox and agreements on release dates in other cities collapsed. The film was not released again until 1946.
