

Is your library making news?

Library now available to read



Started earlier this year, the Indiana State Library's Newspaper Preservation blog was created for newspaper archivists and librarians and is intended to fill the void resulting from the lack of scholarly journal articles or scientific studies on the subject.

"I started the Newspaper Preservation blog specifically for those newspaper managers who find themselves in the crosshairs between the patron desk and the archive shelves. Posts in the blog discuss the importance of preservation techniques, the sanctity of local journalism and how we respond to the changing world of born-digital newspapers and mass publication closings," said David Pleiss, blog author and newspaper librarian at the Indiana State Library.

Pleiss also cites making newspapers available to the public as a contributing factor in why he decided to start the blog. "The idea is to preserve newspapers and make them as accessible to the public as possible. Once in my current position, I found a surprising lack of information online about newspaper preservation and how it relates to the goals of the library: creating and maintaining accurate finding aids, making objects accessible online and rendering microfilm accessible and searchable," Pleiss said.

Recently, Pleiss helped a North Carolina researcher find information about Civil War physician Dr. Almira Fifield by locating a seemingly lost 1800s Valparaiso Republic newspaper master reel in the State Library's collection. Read the post <u>here</u>.

fundraising goal for Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, a program dedicated to fostering early childhood literacy by providing free, age-appropriate books to children from birth to age five.

"This milestone reflects the generosity of our community, the trust they have in our library and the value they place on nurturing a love of reading in our youngest neighbors," said Allen county Public Library executive director Susan P. Baier. "With these funds, the library will be able to launch the Imagination Library program in the coming months, ensuring that children will begin receiving books in their homes even sooner than we'd hoped."

The funds were raised from a combination of sources including donations from individuals, family foundations, social and civic organizations, businesses, library employees and members of the Friends of the Library. The Allen County Public Library Foundation also stirred fundraising during the middle of the campaign with a generous \$25,000 match from its own funds. A \$5,000 gift from the employees at the Meijer on Dupont Road presented on Oct. 14 pushed the campaign well over its goal.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library has distributed millions of books to children around the world, helping to create a foundation for literacy and a lifelong love of reading. In Allen County, the program already has a list of more than 1,500 children awaiting the program. Upon launch, Allen County will join the other 87 Indiana counties who already host the program.

The \$100,000 campaign will be matched by funding from Gov. Eric Holcomb's Next Level Agenda and will fund the first two years of the program. The program requires continued support and the community is invited to make donations <u>here</u> or by visiting any Allen County Public Library branch.



The Friends of the Frankfort Public Library have announced the 43rd Annual Art Exhibition and Sale entitled, "Art Unleashed," on Nov. 8-10. Taking place on the second level of the Frankfort Community Public Library, the exhibition will feature the work of more than 90 artists from across Indiana. The exhibit will include ceramics, jewelry, photography, printmaking, drawings, woodworking, textiles, paintings and glass. Visitors will hear live music during opening night and see artist demonstrations throughout Saturday.

The Annual Art Show serves as the Friends' largest fundraiser, helping the library to continue to provide arts and children's programming. The event would not be possible without the generous support of volunteers, patrons and community.
