# Free training for librarians and library

12 students in the United States. This year, <u>National Chemistry</u> <u>Week</u> occurs between Oct. 20-26.

## Purdue Libraries Banned Books Week workshop to take place tomorrow

### CELEBRATE BANNED BOOKS WEEK WITH PURDUE LIBRARIES

Tomorrow, on Thursday, Sept. 26 at 11 a.m. at the West Lafayette Public Library, Purdue Libraries will celebrate Banned Books Week with a workshop.

In this workshop, Shannon M. Oltmann, associate professor in the School of Information Science at the University of Kentucky will discuss the basic elements of intellectual freedom, with particular attention to how to implement this principle in public and school libraries. Oltmann will discuss book challenges and responding to patron concerns about library books and resources. Discussion will include creating meaningful policies and training for library workers. Plenty of time will be allotted for questions and discussion. This workshop is geared toward public and school library workers.

Oltmann's research interests include information ethics, censorship, intellectual freedom and qualitative research methods. She wrote the book "Practicing Intellectual Freedom in Libraries" and edited "The Fight Against Book Bans: Perspectives from the Field." Oltmann's work has been funded by the American Library Association and the Institute of Museum and Library Services.
