"The idea of naming a library branch after Jos N. Holman began over five years ago when the Wea Prairie Branch was under construction," said Tippecanoe County Public Library Board of Trustees president Grant Fischer. "Both current and past library board members believed the downtown branch was the best fit to share Jos's name."

Holman began working as the director of the Tippecanoe County Public Library in 2002.

"Jos Holman has served as the Tippecanoe County Public Library County Librarian for over 20 years. In that time, he has been instrumental in growing our library system and evolving our libraries to meet our growing community needs," Fischer added.

In March of 2023, demolition began on an 18-month downtown library renovation project. The renovation was completed in August of this year. Read more about the recently completed renovation <u>here</u>.

The Jos N. Holman Branch hosts a collection of over 250,000 materials available for checkout, including books, movies, nonfiction, materials in Spanish, audiobooks, music, magazines and online resources.

### Greensburg-Decatur County Public Library to host Dr. William Cooke

The exhibit - located in the Exhibit Hall on the first floor of the Indiana State Library - provides a snapshot of the passenger experience of steam and electric railroads in Indiana, told by tangible material culture that has been carefully preserved at the Indiana State Library over time. Brightly-colored posters, railway timetables, photographs and menus from Union Station in Indianapolis are meant to provide a brief glimpse into railway passenger experience in Indiana from the late 19th to early 20th centuries.

Many of the broadsides on display can be found in the Indiana State Library's digital collection that features Chicago and the South Shore and South Bend Railroad. Click <u>here</u> to view the broadsides in the library's digital collection.

The Greensburg-Decatur County Public Library and the Decatur County Health Department will host Dr. William Cooke for an author talk and community resource fair on Sept. 12 at the Decatur County Health Department.

Cooke was the sole doctor in Austin, Indiana when he found himself at the crossroads of two unprecedented health-care disasters: an opioid epidemic and the worst drug-fueled HIV outbreak ever seen in a rural American community. It made national and international news. He writes about his experience in his memoir, "Canary in the Coal Mine." His story is compelling and is relatable to communities throughout Indiana.

The author talk with Cooke will take place from 6-7 p.m., while the resource fair will take place from 4-6 p.m. and from 7-8 p.m. The event is free and open to the public.
