Indiana 211 collaborates with Indiana State Library



Indiana 211 is a division of the Family and Social Services
Administration that connects all Hoosiers to resources in their area. Its mission is to improve quality of life by connecting people to health and human service resources through a highly-skilled team of community navigators. There are no eligibility requirements, income standards or rules to use the service. Anyone can call 2-1-1. The service is statewide, confidential, free and is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to Hoosiers.

Through collaboration with the Indiana State Library, Indiana 211 hopes to increase awareness of the program to the citizens of Indiana and to add additional resources to the Indiana 211 database.

Maintained and updated by the Indiana 211 Database Curation Team, the database provides information on thousands of resources and services represented across a variety of needs – everything from soup kitchens to legal aid to mental health resources.

Housing, utilities assistance and food continue to be the greatest needs. However, Indiana 211 is perpetually trying to grow its resources toward areas of unmet needs. Pillars of focus for 2024 include food, housing, transportation and domestic violence, but there are many other areas of focus, including utilities, healthcare, mental health, employment and education. Through its Meet Your Neighbor programming series, the library is introducing the public to the diverse groups that call Indianapolis home.

The library's immigrant outreach program specialist Sakura Fuqua designed the Meet Your Neighbor programming series. Throughout the year, the library has Meet Your Neighbor programs online and in person at various library branch locations. These programs allow patrons to learn about diverse communities from programming partners such as Kristopher George with Exodus Refugee Immigration and Ally Mulumba, director of strategic partnerships at Patchwork Indy.
