Section 12, Indiana Code I.C. 16-37-1-12, "A local health officer shall provide a certificate of birth or stillbirth upon request by any person only if the officer is *SATISFIED* that the applicant has a *DIRECT INTEREST* in the matter requested and after the health officer determines that the certificate is necessary for the determination of personal property rights for compliance with State and Federal laws. However, the local health officer *MUST* issue a certificate of an applicant's own birth registration."

Indiana Code 16-37-1-12 is amended to read in part as follows: "The local health officer shall maintain a permanent record, accompanying the birth records, which contains for each request for a certified copy of a birth certificate".
