

Clinton County Health Department Home Based Vendor (HBV) Registration Form

Indiana House Enrolled Act 1149 was signed into law in April 2022 which allows certain food products to be made in a private residence and then be legally sold anywhere directly to an end consumer in person, by mail, or shipping by a third-party carrier inside the state of Indiana. You can find specific information on this law and the rules on what is and is not allowed to be made and sold by an HBV at the following website: [Home Based Vendors Doc \(in.gov\)](#) The regulatory authority may need to inquire, ask questions, and examine food product labeling of the HBV to ensure that they are compliant with this law.

We are requesting a few pieces of information that will help the HBVs and the inspectors stay on the same page and avoid any problems at the point of sale. Having this information will also be valuable to us so that as new laws, guidance, or information become available regarding HBVs, we may pass that information on to you. This form is voluntary.

Upon request, the vendor shall provide a copy of the certificate to the local health department or an end consumer.
