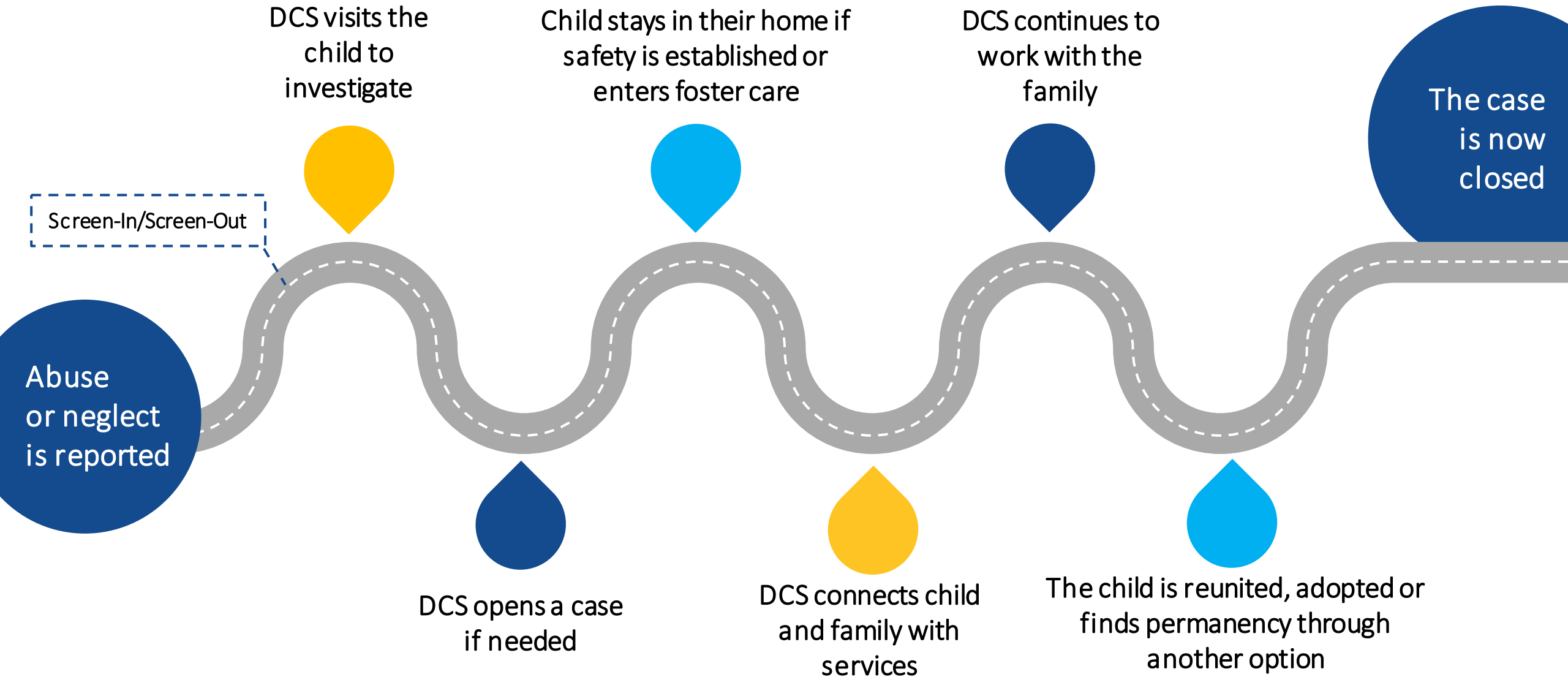

# Existing Reports

## → Reports are hard to navigate/find

To navigate to reports, there are multiple links and clicks required to get to one monthly report

## → Static monthly reports don't give the whole story

Difficult to understand trend over time or which geographic areas might need public assistance, such as additional foster homes.

# Framework

## How do we create a dashboard that all users could understand?

While DCS has built up its Tableau/reporting team, none of us had experience creating a dashboard for the general public

- **Problem:** DCS data is complicated, and at times, can be difficult to explain
  - **Solution:** Utilized Comms and Executive Team to provide concise and clear information in the dashboards
- **Problem:** No experience creating a dashboard like the ones already publicly available in other agencies
  - **Solution:** Partner with MPH to learn best practices

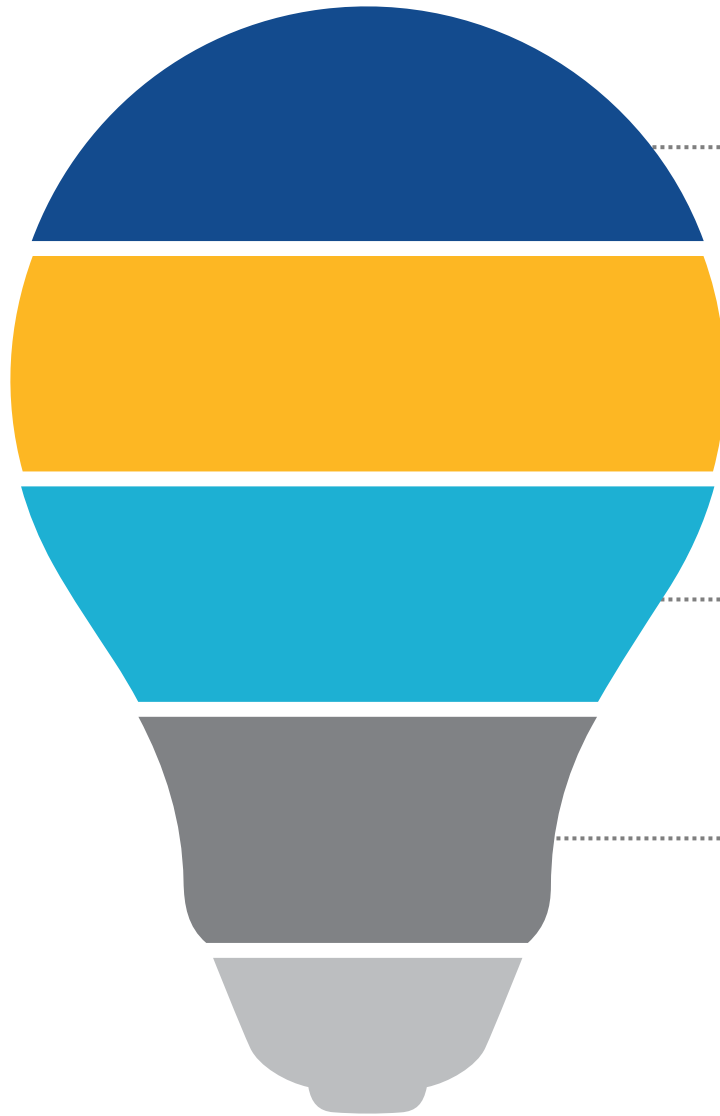

# Goals



1

## Easy to understand and navigate

Simple and informative – allows any level of users to be able to get the information they need as quickly as possible

2

## Ability to see on a statewide and local level

Compare county to statewide – see where areas compare to one another and might need other assistance, such as recruiting more foster parents

## Ability to see trends over time

Year by year, month by month – provide users ability to view trends over time in any way they want and in any timeframe they want

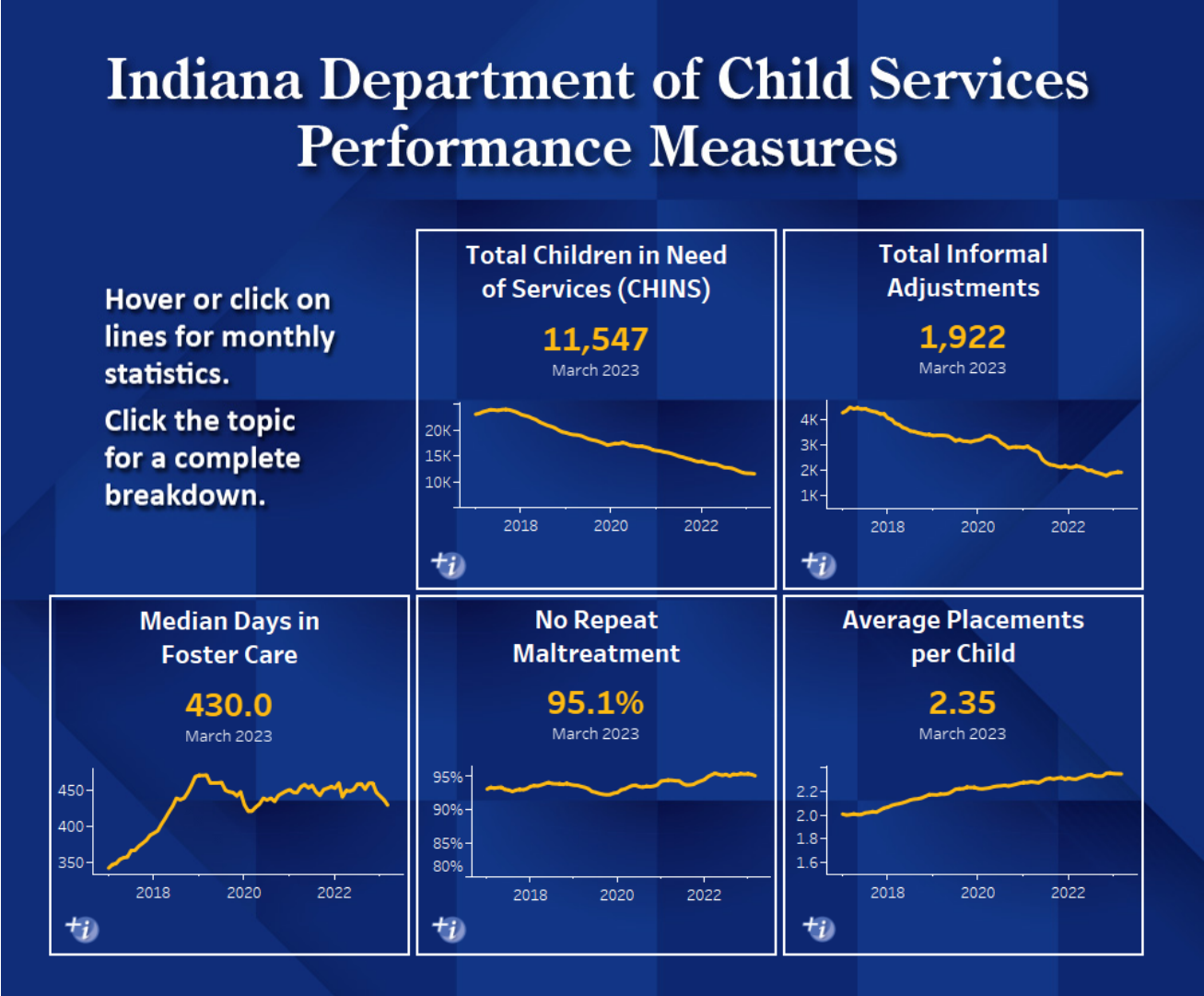

## Data security and automation

Minimize work later – ensure data is on a separate server and can only access public data; automate refresh to minimize manual work

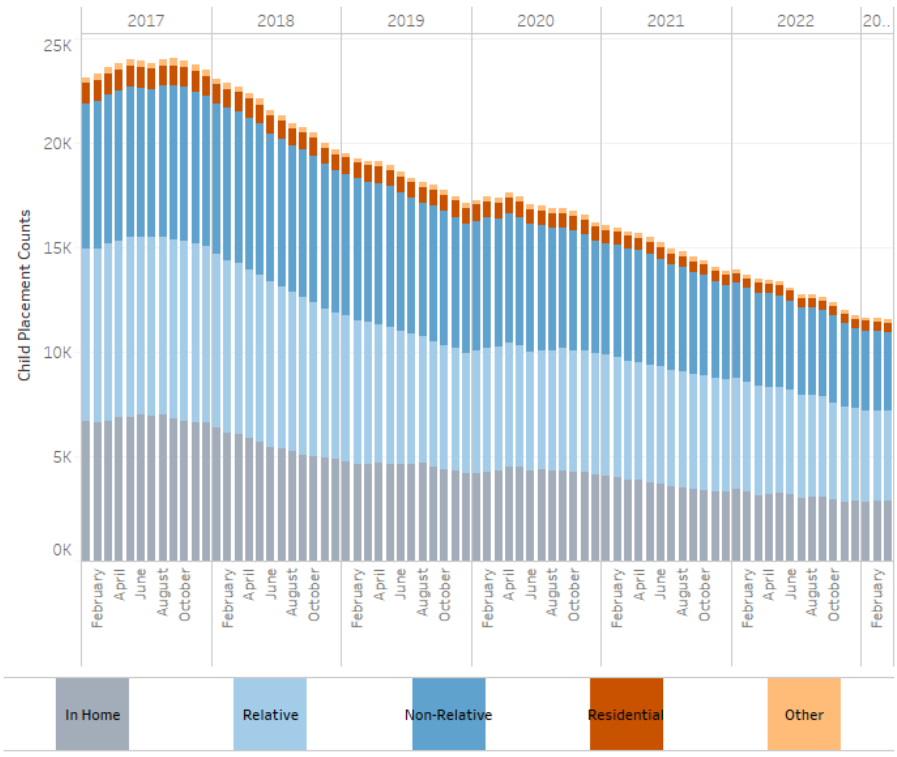
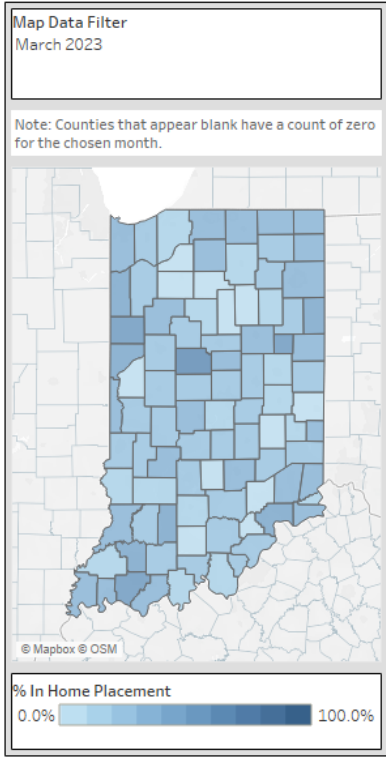

## → Working on second phase

## → New System
