NORTHWESTERN INDIANA REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION FINANCE AND PERSONNEL COMMITTEE October 15, 2024 / NIRPC Dune Room – 8:30 a.m.

Members present Edward Morales, Wendy Mis, David Phelps

<u>Staff and others present</u> George Topoll, Talaya Jones, Lisa Todd, Meredith Stilwell, Darin Sherman

<u>Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance</u> Wendy Mis called the meeting to order at 8:32 a.m.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the August 15, 2024, Finance & Personnel Committee meeting was presented. On a motion by David Phelps, seconded by Edward Morales, and with no opposition, the minutes were approved.

Review of Financial Status - July 2024 Budget vs Actual

The July 2024 bank reconciliations for the NIRPC general account, the CARES Revolving Loan Fund account, the La Porte Revolving Loan Fund Account, and the Marquette Greenway account were made available for review prior to the meeting and included in the meeting packet.

Talaya presented the general fund financial reports, year to date, July 2024. Total general fund expenditures for the period ending July 31, 2024, were \$1,925,798 of the \$4,333,880 budgeted.

Total general fund revenue for the period was \$1,342,281 of the \$4,333,880 budgeted.

Talaya presented the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Securities (CARES) Act financial reports, year to date, July 2024. Total NIRPC CARES fund expenditures for the period ending July 31, 2024, was \$49,185 of the \$644,000 budgeted. There is a sunset for the funds, but an extension was granted until March 2025. Talaya noted there is some subrecipient money still in the grant and a further extension will be requested. Total CARES revenue collected for the period was \$53,106 of the \$78,000 budgeted.

Approval of Claims Registers - July 2024

Talaya presented the July 2024 General Fund claims totaling \$918,796.77 to the Committee. She pointed out that the last entry in the registry should not have been on the register and asked the Committee to table the report due to error. Upon discussion the committee members agreed to move forward with approval of the general claims less the \$34,399.25 incorrect entry. On a motion by Edward Morales, seconded by David Phelps, and with no opposition, the General Fund register of claims for \$884,397.52 was approved. Talaya explained to the new committee members that the claims are already expended before they are brought to the Committee. A brief discussion was held regarding NIRPC's involvement with Partners For Clean Air in doing their books and serving as a passthrough for their funds.

Talaya presented the July 2024 CARES claims totaling \$34,399.25 to the Committee for approval. The payment to Bluum of Texas was for new NIRPC laptops and equipment. On a motion by David Phelps, second by Edward Morales, and no opposition, the General Fund register of claims for \$34,399.25 was approved.

Talaya presented the July 2024 Marquette Greenway claims register totaling \$69,750.00 to the Committee for approval. On a motion by David Phelps, second by Edward Morales, and no opposition, the General Fund register of claims for \$69,750.00 was approved.

Review of Financial Status - August 2024 Budget vs Actual

The August 2024 bank reconciliations for the NIRPC general account, the CARES Revolving Loan Fund account, the La Porte Revolving Loan Fund Account, and the Marquette Greenway account were made available for review prior to the meeting and included in the meeting packet.

Talaya presented the general fund financial reports, year to date, August 2024. Total general fund expenditures for the period ending August 31, 2024, were \$2,133,893 of the \$4,333,880 budgeted.

Total general fund revenue for the period was \$2,334,155 of the \$4,333,880 budgeted. Discussion was held regarding the fact that collections are quarterly, with some funds backended.

Talaya presented the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Securities (CARES) Act financial reports, year to date, August 2024. Total NIRPC CARES fund expenditures for the period ending August 31, 2024, was \$59,145 of the \$644,000 budgeted. Total CARES revenue collected for the period was \$63,205 of the \$78,000 budgeted.

Approval of Claims Registers – August 2024

Talaya presented the August 2024 General Fund claims totaling \$729,582.08 to the Committee. On a motion by David Phelps, seconded by Edward Morales, and with no opposition, the General Fund register of claims for \$729,582.08 was approved.

Talaya presented the August 2024 CARES claims totaling \$44,344.25 to the Committee for approval. Talaya pointed out that the entry to Bluum of Texas was a duplicate of the July entry due to the fact that the check was lost in and NIRPC paid by ACH. On a motion by Edward Morales, seconded by David Phelps, and no opposition, the General Fund register of claims for \$44,344.25 was approved.

EcoInteractive, Inc. Contract

Lisa Todd presented the EcoInteractive contract. EcoInteractive is the vendor for the electronic version of NIRPC's Transportation Improvement Program. The first contract was awarded to them from a 2017 Request for Proposals. This would be the second contract and is a 3-year contract not to exceed \$169.147.00 with optional extensions for years 4 and 5. Since it was cost prohibitive to change vendors and reenter all information, NIRPC was given approval from INDOT to do this contract award as a single source procurement. Attorney Hollenbeck reviewed the contract and given his approval. On a motion by Edward Morales, seconded by David Phelps, and no opposition, the contract was favorably recommended to the NIRPC Executive Board for approval.

FY 2024 Budget Amendment #1

Talaya presented budget amendment #1, which consists of a \$10,000 transfer within the maintenance category. The transfer of funds is from the copier leasing line item to the computer service line item to cover the requirement of Cyber Crime insurance. On a motion by David Phelps, second by Edward Morales, and no opposition, budget amendment #1 was approved.

FY 2025 Preliminary Budget

Talaya gave a bit of background on how NIRPC operates for a budget to new committee members explaining that the draft budget is typically presented in October and 95% of NIRPC's funding is through grants, with 95% of that using local share. She also noted that NIRPC has seven reimbursable transit subrecipients. NIRPC owns the vehicles and leases them to the subrecipients. Talaya presented the draft total budget of \$18,926,476 with the disclaimer that some final numbers are still unknow. Discussion was held regarding some of the changes from the 2024 to 2025 budget. There will be a November meeting to go over changes, and final figures explained at that meeting.

Personnel updates

Meredith Stilwell reported that the new planner position has not yet been posted.

Other Business

Bob Carnahan asked the Committee to keep Mitch in their prayers.

Adjournment

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:31.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE NORTHWESTERN INDIANA REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION AND DRIVE CLEAN INDIANA, INC., FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING SERVICES SERVICES JULY 1, 2024 – DECEMBER 31, 2025

- **WHEREAS**, the Commission submitted a request to fund a Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality air quality education program targeting the general public and fleet operators; and
- WHEREAS, the request specifically included Drive Clean Indiana as the sub-grantee to conduct education, outreach, and training to vehicle fleet operators within Lake, Porter, and LaPorte Counties; and
- WHEREAS, the project was found eligible by the CMAQ Eligibility Committee; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Commission has determined that public education in the form of training about the project and its air quality benefits would be highly beneficial; and
- **WHEREAS,** Contractor has represented that it possesses the capability and expertise to provide these services in a timely manner; and
- WHEREAS, the total dollars allocated for this Public Private Partnership activity within the 2025 Unified Planning Work Program Air Quality Public Education Work Plan are \$450,000 of which \$ 360,000 is federal funding to be allocated as follows: NIRPC \$ 10,000 and DCI
- **\$ 440,000.** Drive Clean Indiana will be reimbursed no more than 80% of their allocated total, not to exceed **\$ 352,000**;
- **WHEREAS,** the entire Air Quality Public Education project has been included in and approved by the Commission in the current Transportation Improvement Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD that the parties to this Agreement do mutually agree as follows:

- 1. **Scope of Work**: Drive Clean Indiana shall perform the services and provide the products to the satisfaction of the Commission as described in the scope of work (Attachment A to this Agreement), which is hereby made a part of this Agreement. The Commission requires prior approval of the procurement and use of any Sub-Contractors for this agreement, and a copy of the executed agreement between the Contractor and Sub-Contractor.
- 2. **Schedule**: All work described in Attachment A shall be conducted within the time frame beginning July 1, 2024, and shall be completed in total no later than December 31, 2025.
- 3. **Compensation**: The maximum total amount, which may be paid to the Contractor for services performed in conjunction with this Agreement, is not to exceed **\$ 352,000_**with contractor to document payment of an additional **\$ 88,800**, by itself or other non-federal parties, toward activities in Attachment A. Total of **\$ 440,000 in** documented services must be performed to receive the full reimbursement of **\$ 352,000**.
- 4. **Payment Provisions**: The Commission shall reimburse the Contractor for services rendered in Attachment A upon submission and review by the Commission of claim

vouchers for work accomplished during designated period on a quarterly basis in accordance with the following procedures:

- (A) The Contractor shall submit invoices with progress reports to the Commission no less than quarterly and no more than monthly.
- (B) The Contractor shall attach supporting documentation of time charges and copies of receipts for all other types of charges to its invoice. The Contractor shall attach copies of invoices with similar supporting documentation from pre-approved Subcontractors utilized in conjunction with this Agreement.
- (C) NIRPC shall reimburse the Contractor 80% of total eligible documented expenses supporting the agreed upon scope of work. The remaining 20% shall remain the responsibility of Drive Clean Indiana as non-federal reimbursable match of the federal grant.
- 5. The Invoice shall be accompanied by a documentation of activities included in the Activity Report Summary portion of the invoice for which reimbursement is being claimed. Quarterly/Monthly Invoices are due on the dates specified in Attachment A. Failure to resolve questions or concerns may result in delay of payment processing. The Contractor may be required to provide documentation of Non-Federally reimbursed expenses included as match similar to reimbursed expense.
 - (A) Following its approval of the invoice and related materials submitted by the Contractor, the Commission shall invoice the Indiana Department of Transportation for payment. Payment to the contractor will be made within 10 days of receipt of federal funds from the state.
 - (B) All invoices with supporting documentation shall be mailed or emailed to:

- 6. Modifications: This agreement shall not be modified except in writing, signed by both parties to this agreement. The parties agree that the Commission may modify ATTACHMENT A SCOPE OF SERVICES by adding, deleting, or modifying tasks, subtasks, and schedules, or the content or quantity of products to be produced by the Contractor to the extent that such modifications have no upward or downward adjustment in the total cost of this agreement. Any adjustment in total cost for the services described in this agreement shall be negotiated between the Commission and the Contractor, shall be in writing, signed by both parties, and appended to this agreement.
- 7. Independent Contractor: Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as creating an employer/employee relationship between the Commission and the Contractor. The Contractor understands and agrees that any and all tax liability that might be assessed on fees paid by the Commission to the Contractor is its sole responsibility.

- 8. Insurance: The Contractor agrees to maintain comprehensive insurance including, but not limited to, Federal, State, or Local employers' liability, workers' compensation, social security unemployment compensation, comprehensive general liability insurance, and automobile liability insurance with respect to its own employees in amounts customarily maintained in its industry and agrees that any liability arising out of the services rendered hereunder shall not be limited to the Contractor insurance coverage.
- 9. Indemnity: The Contractor shall defend, indemnify, protect and hold harmless the Commission, its officers, directors, employees, and independent contractors from any and all liability occasioned wholly or in part by any negligent act, failure to exercise the care customary in the profession, or errors or omission of the Contractor; including liability resulting from willful or intentional violation by the Contractor of proprietary rights, copyrights, or rights of privacy, arising out of the publication, translation, quotation, reproduction, delivery, use, performance, or disposition of data furnished by the Contractor, its independent contractors, agents or employees; including any and all expenses, legal or otherwise, incurred by the Commission in defense of any claim or suit arising out of services provided under this agreement.
- 10. Delays: The Contractor shall perform its services with due diligence upon receipt of a written notice to proceed from the Commission. Neither party shall be responsible for delays nor failure in performance due to causes beyond the reasonable control of either party. The Contractor will notify the Commission immediately of any event that will delay deliverables and provide the Commission with a written notice thereof specifying the reasons for the delay and actions planned to compensate for the delay in performance. The Commission will not unreasonably withhold an extension to the term of this agreement.
- 11. Termination: This agreement may be terminated, in whole, or in part, if the Commission shall determine that such termination is in its best interests. Upon receipt of written notice of termination from the Commission, thirty (30) days thereafter, the Contractor shall discontinue performance and refrain from incurring further costs unless otherwise directed; and within thirty (30) days deliver to the Commission all data, graphics, summaries, reports, and other information and materials the Contractor has accumulated in the performance of services under the agreement, whether completed or in process.

If termination is for convenience, the Contractor shall be compensated for all services performed and reasonable costs incurred up to the effective date of termination, subject to the elements of *Compensation* and *Terms of Payment* reference in other sections of this agreement.

12. Access to records: The Contractor hereby agrees to submit to the Commission, such annual or special financial and operating reports as the Commission may reasonably request. The Contractor also agrees to make available for the inspection, by any duly authorized agent of the Commission, any records, documents, leases, operation and use agreements and other instruments which affect the Operator and are pertinent to the project funded, in part, through this Agreement.

The Contractor also agrees to permit the Commission, the Indiana State Board of Accounts, U.S. Secretary of Transportation, and the Comptroller General of the United States, or their authorized representatives, to inspect all work, materials, payrolls, and other data, and to audit

the books, records, and accounts of the Contractor pertaining to the project funded, in part, through this Agreement.

- 13. Covenant Against Contingent Fees: The Contractor warrants that it has not:
 - Employed or retained for a commission, percentage, brokerage, contingent fee, or other consideration, any firm or person to solicit or secure this agreement, other than a bona fide employee of the firm;
 - Agreed, as an expressed or implied condition for obtaining this agreement, to employ or retain the services of any firm or person in connection with carrying out the agreement; or
 - Paid, or agreed to pay, to any firm, organization or person (other than a bona fide employee of the firm) any fee, contribution, donation, or consideration of any kind for, or in connection with, procuring or carrying out the agreement.
- 14. Successors and Assigns: This agreement shall be binding upon the Contractor and the Commission, their successors, and assigns. The Contractor shall not assign, subcontract, transfer, or otherwise dispose of any interest in this agreement without the prior written approval of the Commission.
- 15. Confidentiality and Data Rights: The Contractor agrees to treat as confidential all proprietary or confidential information provided by the Commission and not divulge such information to their parties, or the Contractor's employees except on a "need to know" basis.
- 16. Severability: Should any provision of this agreement at any time, be in conflict with any statute, administrative ruling or regulation, or be unenforceable for any reason, then the provision shall continue in effect only to the extent that it remains valid. If any provision of this agreement becomes unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.
- 17. Waiver and Interpretation: The failure of the Commission or the Contractor to insist upon strict adherence to any term of this agreement at any time shall not be considered a waiver. Any waiver of any term of this agreement must be in writing and signed by both parties. The Commission's determination as to the true meaning and intent of any ambiguities in the agreement shall be final and conclusive.
- 18. Civil Rights: The Contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment on the basis of race, color, creed, sex, disability, age, or national origin. The Contractor agrees to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, creed, sex, disability, age, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.
- 19. No Federal Obligations to Third Parties: Absent the federal government's express written consent, the federal government shall not be subject to any obligations or liabilities to any sub-recipient, third party contractor, or any other person not a party to the grant agreement in connection with the performance of activities for the project.

Notwithstanding, any concurrence provided by the federal government in or approval of any solicitation, sub-agreement, or third-party contract, the federal government continues to have no obligation or liabilities to any party, including the sub-recipient and third party contractor.

- 20. Applicability of federal requirements: The Contractor agrees that it will abide by and fulfill all requirements of the federal government that are applicable to this agreement.
- 21. Authorized Representatives: The Commission's authorized, administrative representative for these services is Ms. Talaya Jones, Chief Financial Officer. The authorized technical project manager is Ms. Katherine Luther, Chief of Staff and Environmental Director.

ATTACHMENT A – SCOPE OF WORK July 1, 2024 –December 31, 2025 Drive Clean Indiana Air Quality Public Education and Outreach Program

The Northwestern Indiana Regional Planning Commission (NIRPC) is contracting with Drive Clean Indiana, Inc. (Contractor) to implement aspects of the Northwest Indiana Air Quality Public Education and Outreach program focusing on on-road/off-road equipment and fleets.

The NIRPC and DCI relationship represents a public-private partnership project, which is an eligible activity under CMAQ. NIRPC has included the fleet education, outreach, and training activities performed by DCI in the 2025-2026 UPWP. The Contractor has an established relationship with many private and public sector vehicle fleet operators in Northwest Indiana. They have successfully participated in a competitive CMAQ grant application process, and this activity of the partnership has been found eligible and approved by state and federal agencies responsible for these funds.

Contractual Responsibilities:

The Region brand and education and outreach campaign is focused specifically on coordination/leverage of area resources and efforts to raise awareness of the importance of air quality forecasts, provide education on the effects of pollutants including ozone and particulate matter, and encourage voluntary actions to reduce air pollution from transportation sources and promote moving toward cleaner air.

Task 1: NWI Air Quality Public Education, Outreach, Partnerships, and Media \$ 173,500 (\$138,800 Federal, \$34,700 Local)
