- 3. Meet EDA's Regional **Distress** Criteria:
 - > Income
 - > Unemployment
 - Special Need



Benefits to Becoming an EDD

- >FY 2023 EDA INVESTMENTS IN INDIANA: \$10,593,709
- >FY 2023 EDA LEVERAGED FUNDS THROUGH LOCAL MATCH: \$14,326,491
- >TOTAL FOR INDIANA REGIONS: \$24,920,200



EDD Specifics



The area has a per capita income of 80% or less of the national average.




The area has an unemployment rate that is, for the most recent 24-month period for which data are available, at least 1% greater than the national average unemployment rate.



SPECIAL NEED

An area that has experienced or is about to experience a special need arising from actual or threatened severe unemployment or economic adjustment problems resulting from severe short-term or long-term changes in economic conditions such as a military base closure.



Economic <u>Distress</u> in Indiana

- Porter County is distressed by Unemployment
- Lake and LaPorte counties have been distressed by both Unemployment and Income historically
