

Background


- The U.S. Census Bureau designates Urban Areas based on population and housing data collected in the most recent decennial census
- Since the 2000 Census, the NIRPC region has contained two Urban Areas: Chicago IL-IN and Michigan City-La Porte IN-MI
- After the 2020 Census, a portion of the Chicago IL-IN Urban Area was carved out and designated separately as the Valparaiso-Shorewood Forest Urban Area






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
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Background







Funding Implications

The Federal Highway Administration uses urban area designations to determine where Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) are required, and the populations of the urban areas are used to determine the amount of federal transportation funding each MPO and region receive.

- Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program:
 - Group 1 = Large Urban (>200,000 population)
 - Group 2 = Small Urban (50,000 200,000 population)
 - **Group 3** = Municipalities (5,000 49,999 population)
 - **Group 4** = Rural (<5,000 Population)
 - MPOs select projects for Group 1 and 2 funding, although NIRPC still works closely with INDOT on Group 3, and to a lesser extent, on Group 4 funded projects.
 - The State distributes STBG funding using formulas based on the population of the <u>unadjusted</u> urban areas.

MPOs select projects for funding within their Metropolitan Planning Areas

- Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA):
 - The NIRPC Region defined in Ind. Code § 36-7-7.6: Lake, Porter, and LaPorte Counties
 - At a minimum must incorporate <u>applicable urban area(s)</u> and adjacent areas expected to become urbanized within 20 years.
 - Funds may be awarded to projects anywhere within the MPA.




RECOMMENDATION:
