LAW ENFORCEMENT HIRING

Amends 312 IAC 4-4-6 to delete the definition of "spot appointment" and remove the provision concerning spot appointments to a permanent grade for returning conservation officers. Amends 312 IAC 4-5-2 concerning education, degree, and military service requirements for conservation officers. Amends 312 IAC 4-5-3 concerning the use of additional standards to select, train, and promote conservation officers. Effective 30 days after filing with the publisher.

SUMMARY/RESPONSE TO COMMENTS

The Natural Resources Commission (commission) requested public comment from October 9, 2024, through November 8, 2024, and during the public hearing on November 8, 2024. The commission received no comments in response to the Notice of First Public Comment Period.

FINAL RULE

SECTION 1. 312 IAC 4-4-6 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

312 IAC 4-4-6 Review of actions; termination, demotion, or suspension of conservation officer

Authority: IC 14-9-8-3; IC 14-10-2-1; IC 14-10-2-4

Affected: <u>IC 4-21.5-5</u>; <u>IC 14-9-8</u>

Sec. 6. (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), a conservation officer:

- (1) whose employment is terminated; or
- (2) who is demoted or suspended;

as a result of **due to** a final determination by the division director, or a person designated by the division director's **designee**, may seek administrative review from the commission under IC 4-21.5 and 312 IAC 3-1.

- (b) Through the issuance of a general order, The division director may establish a board to provide informal review of any a disciplinary action by issuing a general order. A determination:
 - (1) that is subject to administrative review under subsection (a); and
 - (2) for which informal review is available under this subsection;

is not a final determination until the board completes the **informal** review and makes a written report of its findings.

- (c) Without Absent charges being made filed under section 5 of this rule and without a predisciplinary meeting,
 - (1) a probationary employee may be terminated.
 - (2) At the will of the division director and subject to approval of the director, an officer who received a spot appointment may be returned to the officer's permanent grade before the spot appointment.

An A termination action under this subsection does not entitle a person an individual to administrative review under subsection (a) or to an informal review under subsection (b).

- (d) As used in this section, "spot appointment" means a temporary elevation in grade to captain, major, or lieutenant colonel that:
 - (1) is granted in writing at the discretion of the division director, subject to the approval of the director;
 - (2) states the permanent grade to which the officer would return; and
 - (3) takes effect after July 1, 2014.
- (e) (d) An party individual who is aggrieved by a final agency action of the commission under this section may seek judicial review under <u>IC 4-21.5-5</u>.

SECTION 2. 312 IAC 4-5-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

312 IAC 4-5-2 Prerequisites; conservation officer applicant

Authority: IC 14-9-8-3; IC 14-10-2-4

Affected: IC 14-9-8

Sec. 2. A person **An individual** who wishes to apply applies to become a conservation officer must shall meet each of the following requirements in order to be favorably considered:

- (1) Be Provide proof the individual is a United States citizen, including:
 - (A) a copy of the individual's birth certificate; or
 - (B) a copy of the individual's:
 - (i) naturalization certificate;
 - (ii) certificate of citizenship;
 - (iii) United States passport; or
 - (iv) Consular Report of Birth Abroad (FS-240).
- (2) Possess **Demonstrate** the strength and agility needed to complete the physical conditioning and psychomotor skills requirements established by the Indiana law enforcement training board under <u>250 IAC</u> <u>2-3</u>.
- (3) Have achieved one (1) of the following:
 - (A) An associate's degree (two (2) year program), evidenced by a certified transcript, from a college or university accredited by an organization recognized by the United States Secretary of Education at 34 CFR 602.2.
 - (B) Completion of at least two (2) years toward a bachelor's degree (four (4) year program), evidenced by a certified transcript, from a college or university accredited by an organization recognized by the United States Secretary of Education at 34 CFR 602.2.
 - (C) Four (4) years of full-time active duty United States military service with honorable discharge. Achieve a high school diploma or a general education diploma (GED).
- (4) Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age on the date of appointment.
- (5) Possess a valid driver's license to operate an automobile.
- (6) Be willing, if appointed, Attest the individual is willing to reside and serve any place within Indiana as in any location designated by the division director in a form and manner prescribed by the department.
- (7) Demonstrate an ability to:
 - (A) swim one hundred (100) yards without stopping; and
 - (B) tread water for at least five (5) minutes.
- (8) Successfully complete physical agility testing.
- (9) If requested by the division, submit to and satisfy the following:
 - (A) Standard psychological testing.
 - (B) A polygraph examination.

SECTION 3. 312 IAC 4-5-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

312 IAC 4-5-3 Conservation officer applicant; additional standards

Affected: <u>IC 14-9-8</u>

Sec. 3. **(a)** The division director shall establish additional written standards for the recruitment, selection, training, and promotion of a conservation officers officer.

- (b) If requested by the division, submit to and satisfy the following:
- (1) Standard psychological testing.
- (2) A polygraph examination.
- (c) The division director shall select an individual to become a conservation officer based on indicators the individual will excel in a career in conservation law enforcement, including the individual's:
 - (1) life experiences; and
 - (2) interest in and commitment to natural resources.
