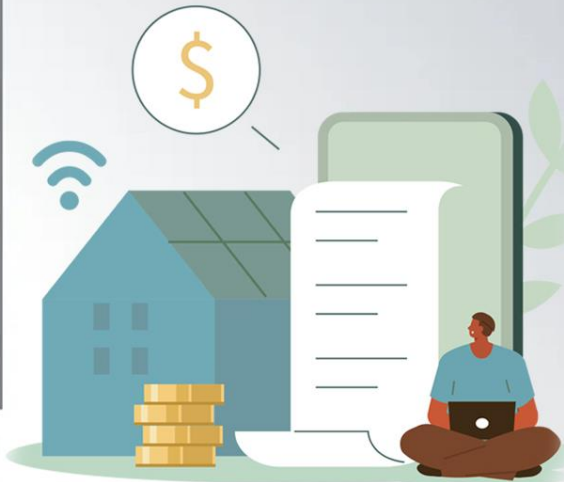
An Overview of the Home Energy Rebates Program

Introduction

- Initiated by federal legislation signed into law on August 16, 2022.
- Part of a larger commitment to energy initiatives, with nearly \$400 billion in funding.

Funding and Focus

- Specifically, \$8.8 billion is allocated for the Home Energy Rebates.
- The rebates are designed to support American households directly by providing energy efficiency savings.
- Minimum of 40% of rebate funds dedicated for low-income households, with at least 10% for low-income multi-family households.

Indiana Home Energy Rebate Program

Empowering Hoosiers to Enhance Home Energy Efficiency

Program Overview

- Indiana has been allocated approximately \$182 million from federal funds under the U.S. Department of Energy.
- The initiative aims to assist Indiana residents in reducing energy costs through energy efficiency improvements.

The funding supports two distinct programs:

- **Home Efficiency Rebate Program (HOMES):** Involves retrofitting homes to enhance energy efficiency.
- **Home Appliance Rebate Program (HEAR):** Encourages the adoption of appliances that consume less energy and are more cost-effective over time.



Home Efficiency Rebate Program (HOMES)

Program Target Group

- Program intended to benefit all Hoosiers.
- Applicable to both single-family and multi-family residential units.

Eligible Upgrades

- **Whole-Home Retrofits:** Includes air sealing, insulation, and retrofits for the installation of heat pump HVAC system, heat pump water heaters and other energy efficiency improvements.

Rebate Details

- Designed to make energy-efficient improvements to the envelope of the home more accessible to those who benefit most.



Home Appliance Rebate Program (HEAR)

Program Target Group

- Tailored specifically for low- and moderate-income households (earning less than 150% of Area Median Income).
- Applicable to both single-family and multi-family residential units.

Eligible Appliance and Equipment Upgrades

- **High-Efficiency Equipment:** Includes heat pump water heaters, space heating and cooling heat pumps, stoves, and clothes dryers.
- **Electrical Upgrades:** Eligibility extends to crucial electrical system enhancements such as service load centers/panels, and electrical wiring.

Rebate Details

- Designed to make energy-efficient appliances and upgrades more accessible to those who benefit most.

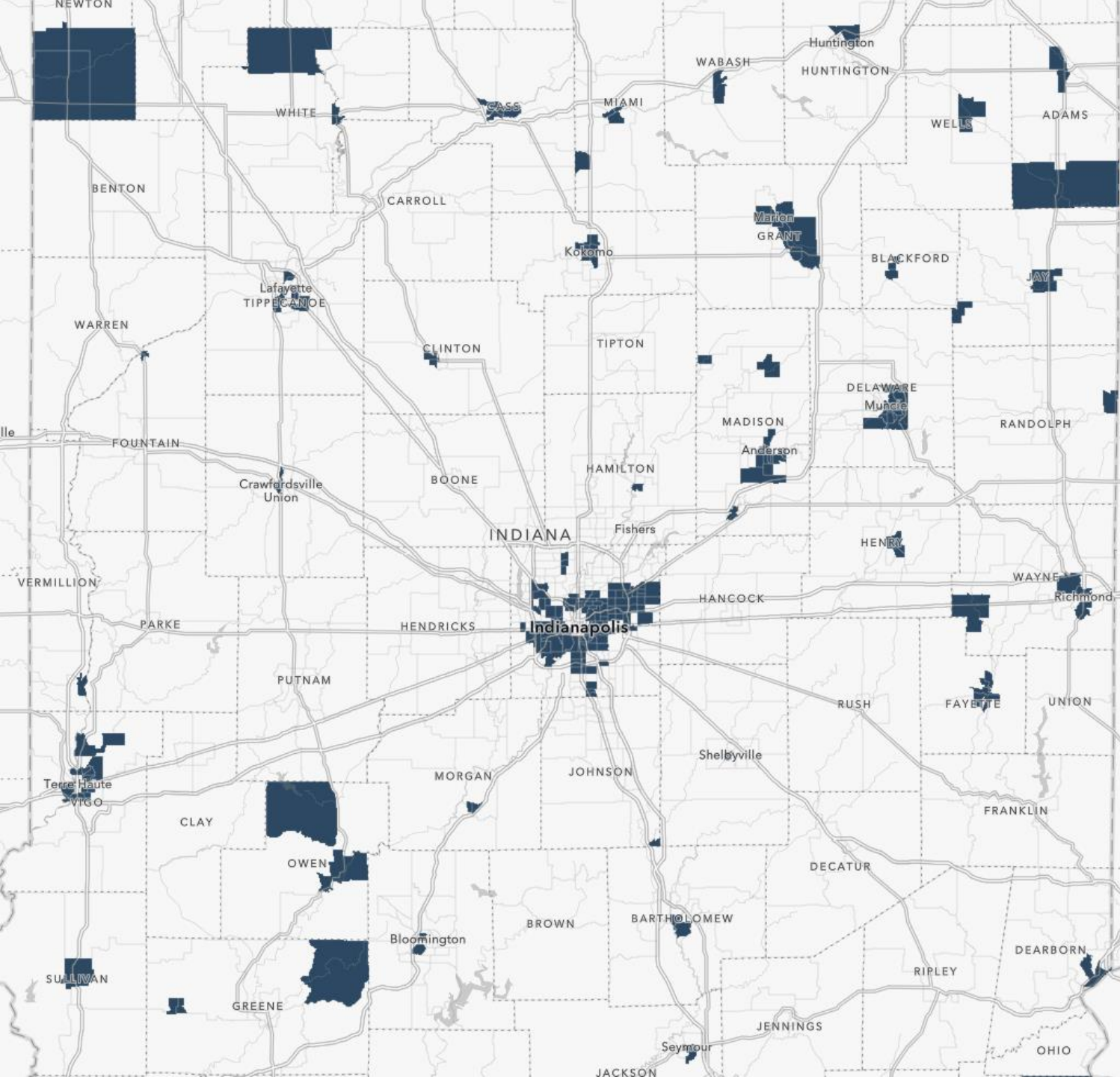

Justice40 Initiative

Bridging the Gap in Clean Energy Access and Benefits

Purpose:

Aims to ensure that 40% of the overall benefits of relevant federal investments flow to disadvantaged communities (DACs).

Priorities:

The initiative focuses on decreasing the energy and environmental burdens on DACs while increasing their access to clean energy and decision-making processes.

Income Verification & Documentation Requirements

Documents may include:

- IRS 1040 Form
- Employer W-2 for each member of the Household
- Proof of Residence

- Methodology for obtaining required data
- Procedures to ensure data protection adheres to DOE standards

Community Benefits Plan

- Strategy to provide program to J40 communities
- Covers workforce support and engagement

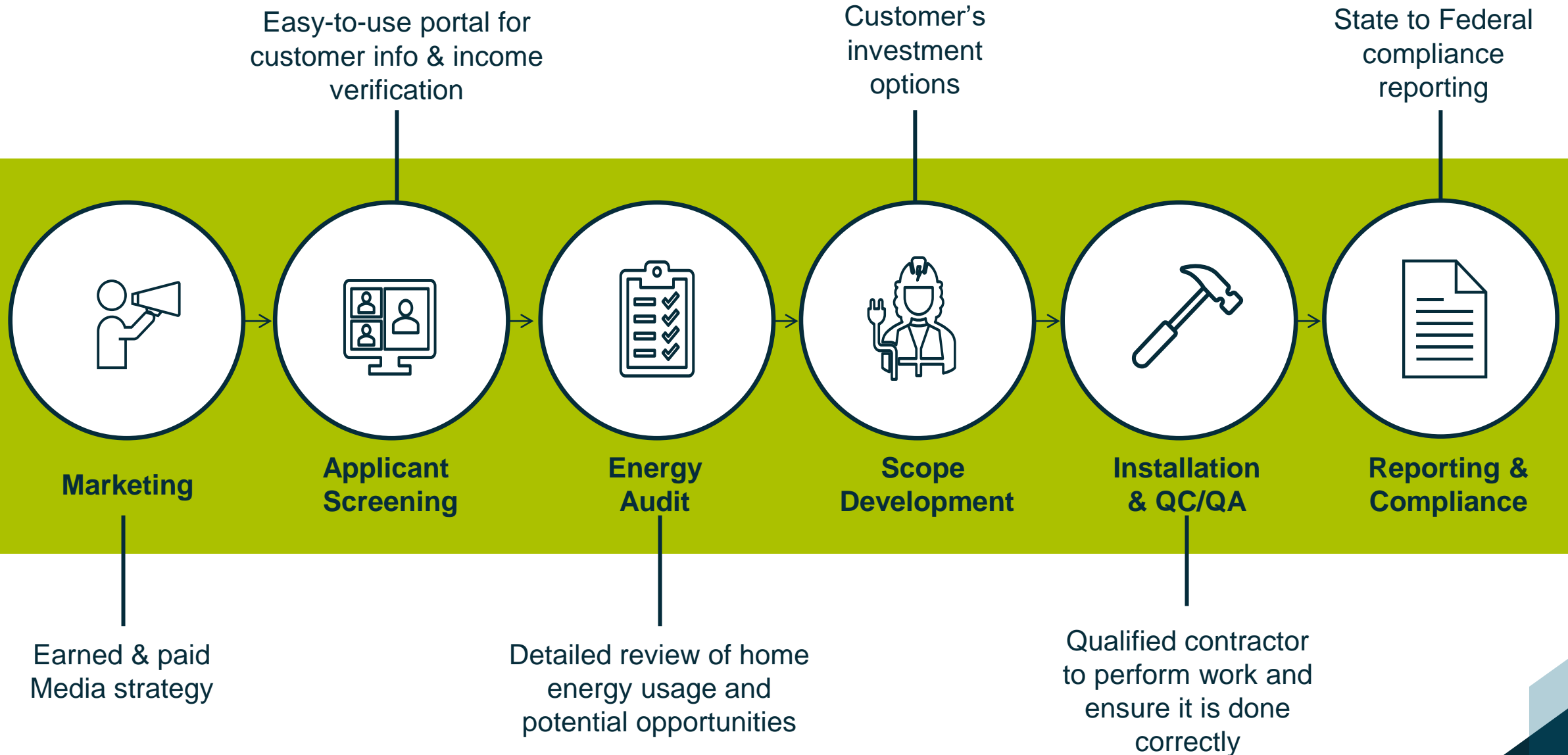
Privacy & Security Risk Assessment Plan

- Ensuring sensitive and personal data is transferred and stored safely and securely

- Covers anticipated long-term impacts and goals of program

Home Energy Rebate Programs

The Home Energy Rebate programs consist of the two separate and distinct energy efficiency-related programs: the Home Efficiency Rebates (HOMES) and the Home Appliance Rebates (HEAR). OED will administer these programs jointly to maximize impact to Hoosiers.

Both programs are expected to become available to Hoosiers in late 2024.

The timing is subject to change based upon the progress of developing the full program applications and receiving approval from the U.S. Department of Energy.

About the Home Efficiency Rebate Program

The Home Efficiency Rebate program, also known as the HOMES program, focuses on energy efficiency upgrades and retrofits to residential buildings, both single-family and multi-family dwellings.
