The Home Energy Rebates Program

Empowering Hoosiers to Enhance Home Energy Efficiency

Program Overview

- \$8.8 billion is allocated for the Home Energy Rebates program by federal legislation signed into law on August 16, 2022.
- Indiana has been allocated approximately \$182 million from federal funds under the U.S. Department of Energy.
- The initiative aims to assist Indiana residents in reducing energy costs through energy efficiency improvements.

The funding supports two distinct programs:

Home Efficiency Rebate Program (HOMES):

Involves retrofitting homes to enhance energy efficiency.

Home Appliance Rebate Program (HEAR):

Encourages the adoption of appliances that consume less energy and are more cost-effective over time.



Home Efficiency Rebate Program (HOMES)

Focus: Achieve energy savings goals through whole-home retrofits.

Eligible Upgrades

 Whole-Home Retrofits: Includes air sealing, insulation, and retrofits for the installation of heat pump HVAC system, heat pump water heaters and other energy efficiency improvements.

Program Target Group

- Program intended to benefit all Hoosiers.
- Applicable to both single-family and multi-family residential units.

Rebate Details

 Designed to make energy-efficient improvements to the envelope of the home more accessible to those who benefit most.



Home Appliance Rebate Program (HEAR)

Focus: Maximum rebate amounts for Energy Efficient appliances and upgrades.

Eligible Appliance and Equipment Upgrades

- High-Efficiency Equipment: Includes heat pump water heaters, space heating and cooling heat pumps, stoves, and clothes dryers.
- Electrical Upgrades: Eligibility extends to crucial electrical system enhancements such as service load centers/panels, and electrical wiring.

Program Target Group

- Tailored specifically for low- and moderate-income households (earning less than 150% of Area Median Income).
- Applicable to both single-family and multi-family residential units.

Rebate Details


 Designed to make energy-efficient appliances and upgrades more accessible to those who benefit most.

Rebate Amounts

DOE Guidance:

Type of Home Energy Project	Maximum Allowed Rebate Amount Per Household Below 80% Area Median Income (AMI)	Maximum Allowed Rebate Amount Per Household Above 80% Area Median Income (AMI)
HOMES Project with at least 20% predicted energy savings	80% of project costs, up to \$4,000	50% of project costs, up to \$2,000 (maximum of \$200,000 for a multifamily building)
HOMES Project with at least 35% predicted energy savings	80% of project costs, up to \$8,000	50% of project costs, up to \$4,000 (maximum of \$400,000 for a multifamily building)
HEAR Project Qualified Technologies (only households with an income below 150% AMI are eligible)	100% of project costs up to technology cost maximums; up to \$14,000	50% of project costs, up to technology cost maximums; up to \$14,000 (households with incomes above 150% AMI are not eligible)



Purpose:

Aims to ensure that 40% of the overall benefits of relevant federal investments flow to disadvantaged communities (DACs).

Priorities:


The initiative focuses on decreasing the energy and environmental burdens on DACs while increasing their access to clean energy and decision-making processes.

Income Verification & Documentation Requirements

Documents may include:

- IRS 1040 Form
- Employer W-2 for each member of the Household
- Proof of Residence

Categorical Eligibility – Documentation of Participation in Programs Below



State Implementation Blueprint – Required Plans

Education & Outreach Plan

- Strategy to inform eligible households
- Must include timeline and programmatic elements

Consumer Protection Plan

 Ensure all Hoosiers receive appropriate benefits, service, & quality contractor experience

Utility Data Access Plan

- Methodology for obtaining required data
- Procedures to ensure data protection adheres to DOE standards

Community Benefits Plan

- Strategy to provide program to J40 communities
- Covers workforce support and engagement


Privacy & Security Risk Assessment Plan

 Ensuring sensitive and personal data is transferred and stored safely and securely

Market Transformation Plan

 Covers anticipated longterm impacts and goals of program


